He is a martial artist, a former boxer, and has logged 2,033 freefall parachute jumps.

He is a 32nd Degree Mason, a Shriner, and is Past Master of the Bristow Masonic Lodge.

He is very proud of his Native American heritage, and of being an official Warrior of the Comanche Nation. He performs his Native American Program for clubs all over the country.
