# Rotary Club Hot Springs Village



May 26, 2022

Meeting was called to order by Jack. Jack asked for the approval of the April 28<sup>th</sup> minutes and the May 20<sup>th</sup> minutes. Jim made the motion to approve the minutes of the 28<sup>th</sup>. Drew seconded the motion. Drew made the motion to accept the minutes of the 20<sup>th</sup>, David seconded the motion. Both motions were passed.

#### Foundation – Jim Zahnd

At this date we have a total of \$19,698. Matching giving still had a couple of day left in the month. At this point we have had donations of \$6,201.68. We had a coupe come in today and it looks like that number will be closer to \$7,000. He wants to come to the Satellite Meeting this month for one last push. He feels that this has been a successful program.

# Secretary - Kathy Wright

We have 59 members in the Morning group and 36 members in the Evening Group. Greg Gillis has moved to the Satellite Club. Diana Bliffert will be inducted into the Satellite Club meeting next week. Jack asked about a service report and Kathy said she would have a yearend report.

# <u>Treasurer – Brian Castleman</u>

Brian reported that there is \$11,892.08 in the operating account. Haven't had much activity since Harv has been gone except for the room rental and the breakfasts. Brian took in \$1010 for the Change of Gavel, \$139 for 50/50, and \$271 for Happy Dollars. Harv reported the last balance in the Charity Corp is \$23,272.19.

# Membership - Phyllis Johannsen (absent)

David Childs mentioned the table that was displayed at the District Conference. Bill fish said he is impressed and would like our club to serve as a model for other clubs.

David also mentioned that yesterday there was a newcomer event that he attended and passed out at least 30 membership information cards. He feels that we have had visitors who have attended our meeting and it is a positive approach.

## Club Administration - Jack Rueter

Change of gavel is coming up on June 30<sup>th</sup>. At this point we have a poor turn out of attendance, if we do not get members to sign up the venue will be changed to the Diamante Club. This will be announced at both the Morning and Satellite Club. A decision will be made by next week.

He is visiting with Dr. Mary Smith to work on bookshelves and a calming room for her students. This is the grant we will be applying for this coming year. He has the big check so he will bring it to the Satellite Club for the three presentations.

There was an article with a wrap-up of the Mother's Day event. I am currently working on an article about "Rotarian Party Animals". This article will cover some of the fun events we have hosted, Bus Trip, Gambling Museum, and Oaklawn Day at the Races. He also wants to get with Drew about our Grants, how much we are passing out and the different groups that are receiving the grant monies.

Jack asked that David give him a list of all articles that were published for his year-end reports.

### Satellite Club - Melanie Pederson

Greg Gillis has moved his membership to the Satellite Club. Mike Sosha and Ben & Kay Bancroft are interested in joining also so membership is growing. We will be losing Joe Marriott and Greg and Chris Jones. We have one induction coming up in June, Diana Bliffert.

We have issues with the audio and the lighting is also a problem. Bruce Huddleston has bought black out curtains to cover the window glare. We need to re-work the seating arrangements to make it a little easier for people to see.

### <u>President Elect – Bruce Borton</u>

Bruce is working on an organizational chart for the club. Jack suggested that he surround himself with a team of 4-5 people to make decisions on how the club will be run next year. Jack also mentioned that Paul Bridges has agreed to mentor Bruce as the new President. David gave suggestions on how organizational charts can be created.

Hall of Fame will be having a meeting at 2pm on June 10<sup>th</sup>. This meeting will consolidate all the different groups that will be invited to create a master list and discuss options for nominations.

So they will be pushing these plans back to a cruise in early 2024.

David brought forth the idea of Themed Cruises.

Melanie brought up that the Arkansas Heritage Festival is still on for October 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>. Melanie has concerns about what has been organized so far. They would like us to host the wine and cheese tasting event held the night of the concert. We could also have some kind of booth during the day. Jack has concerns about helping with the event because last year we got no credit for Rotary help. This event has to be considered by next year's Board so we will table this conversation till then.

Kathy mentioned that Junior Gold has sent a letter for a donation of \$100 to the program. It was voted on by the Board. Drew made the motion, Kathy seconded the motion. Motion passed.
