ROTARY FELLOWSHIPS

- Rotary Fellowships are groups of Rotary members who share a common interest in recreational activities, sports, hobbies, or professions.
- Enhance their Rotary experience by exploring new opportunities and making connections around the world.
- HOW ROTARY FELLOWSHIPS OPERATE Each fellowship functions independently of Rotary International, establishing its own rules, dues requirements, and administrative structure.
- Membership is open to Rotarians, their family members as well as participants and alumni of all Rotary and Foundation programs.







ROTARY ACTION GROUPS

- Each Rotary Action Group functions independently of Rotary International, with its own rules, dues requirements, and administrative structure.
- In order to receive official RI recognition a prospective group must secure the commitment of at least 25 prospective members representing at least 5 countries and 3 Rotary zones.
- Rotarian Action Groups regularly collaborate and assist clubs and districts with service projects in their area of specialty and expertise. They provide opportunities for Rotarians to engage in meaningful service with likeminded Rotarians outside of their own country.

CLUB EXPERIENCE: CLUB MEETINGS

- Be a welcoming and Inclusive Club; Be Open to New Ideas for Projects, Fundraisers, and Meetings
- Provide a **welcome packet** (hard copy/electronic copy), Send a Thank you email/letter/post card/video after the meeting and Follow-up. Does the welcome packet reflect a Club that values DEI?
- Tap Your Network: Hobbies, Barber, Plumbers, Professionals, Retirees, Stay at Home Moms/Dads, Local Officials (1 or 2 Honorary Memberships) Parents of Scholarship Recipients, Parents of Interact members, and Entrepreneurs.
- **About Our Club** Prepare a presentation slide (1 page) to share with visitors at meetings. Does that presentation slide or brochure reflect the type of people you want to attract. Does it represent your Club as an Inclusive Club? Does it invite the person to see themselves participating in Projects/Fundraisers with your Club.

- Virtual Meetings: Access Speakers of Diverse Backgrounds Locally and Globally
- Offer an **Intro to Rotary** in-person or zoom, 45 mins, presentation should reflect prospect's circle of connection so that prospect understands what Rotary offers to the prospect, as well as, those in his or her circle of connection.

Values & Definitions

Diversity

Acknowledging and respecting differences that exist among people regardless of age, race, ability, ethnicity, family or marital status, gender identity, language, national origin, political affiliation, religion, sexual orientation, and socioeconomic status.

Inclusion

Creating environments of goodwill in which individuals or groups can be and feel welcomed, respected, and valued to fully participate.

Equity -

Employing fair treatment, access, opportunity, and advancement for all, while at the same time, striving to identify and eliminate societal barriers that prevent full participation in all aspects of society.



Upholding the values of truth and equality by using equitable and ethical processes and policies that demonstrate just treatment and outcomes for all.

To **increase your impact** through DEI, you could: • Develop a DEI strategy for your club and emphasize the importance of meaningful service projects to that strategy. • Conduct a community assessment to determine which DEI issues are top concerns in your area.

To **expand your reach** through DEI, you could: • Engage with service clubs and other organizations in your community and learn about their DEI strategies. • Identify real or perceived barriers to joining your club and find ways to eliminate them.

To **enhance participant engagement** through DEI, you could: • Build connections with all Rotary participants and invite them to offer their ideas and observations. • Hold innovation forums and brainstorming sessions with members and participants to gather ideas on DEI in your community.

To **increase your ability to adapt** through DEI, you could: • Review club roles and processes and look for ways to make them more equitable and more inclusive. • Establish a continuity plan so that your DEI efforts will be more cohesive.


