Grant description	Funds smaller, short-term activities that address needs in both your local community and communities worldwide. Priorities given to projects that benefit the community most meaningfully, benefit the greatest number of people, and to those groups with the greatest degree of need. Generally will not consider consecutive or multi-year funding requests. Where do grant funds come from?	Funded by contributions from Rotarians in our District to TRF's Annual Fund three years ago. <i>How are the funds allocated?</i>	50% of donations* made by Rotarians in our District to TRF's Annual Fund three years ago is returned to the District as District Designated Funds (DDF). Up to 50% of this can be used for District Grants.	The balance of our District Designated Funds (at least 50%) is available to match funds from clubs.	Decision on how much funding is available is made by the Board of Trustees of the D6360F, based on income from the year's raffle ticket sales.	At the discretion of the Club Foundation.

<i>Who approves application?</i>	Our District's Grants Subcommittee reviews each application and makes a recommendation to our District's Rotary Foundation Committee, which submits final recommendations to Rotary International for final approval.	The Rotary Foundation approves the project, after our District's Rotary Foundation Committee approves any use of DDF that may be requested as part of the grant.	D6360F Grants Committee makes recommendations, which are then approved by the entire D6360F Board of Trustees.	Decided by the individual Club Foundation.
