In addition to weekly classes, the Crescendo Fiddlers perform throughout the summer at regional folk music festivals, community events, and farmers' markets. Two to three years of playing experience is usually required to handle our repertoire.



Arts Exploration Lab for Teens

Teens can choose up to 4 workshops to explore the arts in ways that they may not have experienced in school. Twelve visual arts workshops cover many topics from comic strip design to screen printing to found object sculpture, resin and more. Another workshop,

Woven Mural, engages teens to become the loom as a large scale woven mural is created. Two workshops, Jazz Improv and Rock, offer participants the opportunity to expand their experience in music. The World Percussion workshop doesn't require experience with musical instruments, providing teens an opportunity to experience music and spoken word together with percussion instruments. The theatre workshop challenges teens to produce a 3 act plan in 2-1/2 hour. Performances created during these workshops are featured in a OPEN MIC to end the teen camp. This program is \$25 and includes snacks and dinner plus entry into the OPEN MIC event.





Bonnie Jo Campbell Exhibit @ Kalamazoo Valley Museum Until Jun 30, 2024

Award-winning local author Bonnie Jo Campbell brings her history, as well as many personal items from her writing world, to the Kalamazoo Valley Museum in a miniexhibit that showcases "What It Means to Be a Hometown Writer." Bonnie was born in 1962 in Comstock, Michigan, and grew up on a small farm with her mother, Susanna, and four siblings (and neighbors and cousins) in a house her grandfather Herlihy built in the

shape of an H. Her first collection of stories, Women & Other Animals, won the Grace Paley Prize in 1999, and her book Q Road was a Barnes & Noble Best New Writers selection. Her next novel, American Salvage, was a National Book Award Finalist and won a National Book Critics Circle award. Once Upon a River, released in 2011, was a national bestseller now published in nine languages and has been adapted to film. Her new novel, The Waters, takes place in a Southwest Michigan swamp and was chosen for Oprah's list of Most Anticipated Books of 2024, the Saturday Evening Post Ten Reads for the New Year, and the Apple Books List. The exhibit, through photos, awards, souvenirs from her travels, and other items, showcases her work as well as her inspirations for writing.




Not Your GRAAMA's Museum

George A. Bayard III, Executive Director of the Grand Rapids African American Museum and Archives (GRAAMA), shares the museum's origin story, a selection of unique local stories he's encountered, and his vision for the futures of both GRAAMA and West Michigan itself.

Bayard holds a Bachelor of Arts in Art Education from the University of Delaware and is a professional picture framer, conservator, appraiser, historian, Black culture expert, and arts advocate. He became regional manager of Philadelphia's largest picture frame chain before moving to Grand Rapids, where he owned the Bayard Gallery of Fine African American Art for thirty years before founding GRAAMA in 2016. Bayard received the 2019 Albert Baxter Award for Local History, the 2020 Carol and David Van Andel Leadership Award, the 2019-2023 Grand Rapid Business Journal 200 Most Powerful People Award, and the 2024 Ethel Coe Humanities Award. Bayard serves on the boards of the Grand Rapids Historical Commission, GVSU's Kutsche Office of Local History, the Michigan Museum Association, and the Grand Rapids Arts Advisory Commission.

She founded Neighborhood Classics, a concert series open to the public and hosted by New York City Public Schools to raise funds for their music education programs, and Philip Glass' Piano Concerto No. 3 was composed for her and co-commissioned by twelve American and Canadian orchestras.

The New York-based artist grew up playing traditional folk music with his family before being inspired by pianists Herbie Hancock, McCoy Tyner, Chick Corea, and Keith Jarrett, whose quartet he later joined. He played with saxophonist Azar Lawrence's band and joined saxophone legend Pharoah Sanders as his pianist/musical director in 2019.

The work of West Michigan's talented artistic community is on view during the annual West Michigan Area Show. Opening Friday, May 3, this crowd-pleasing annual juried exhibition was carefully curated from more than 300 submitted entries, ranging from paintings, prints, and photos to mosaics, ceramics, jewelry, sculpture, and mixed-media works. This year's juror is Jessica Silverman, founder of Jessica



Silverman Gallery in San Francisco. The eponymous gallery was founded in 2008 after Silverman completed an MA in Curatorial Practice at the California College of the Arts, after receiving her BA from Otis College.
