The **Kalamazoo Chinese Academy STARTALK Institute** is a year-round student engagement program that will take place from spring 2024 to spring 2025. This year's program is for students in 5th to 9th grade (beginner to intermediate-level) to learn the Chinese language in an immersive environment. The program theme is "Amazing Beijing" and this theme will guide all standard-based instruction and learning throughout the program. Students will undergo a virtual cultural tour to Beijing in Mainland China. Classes will have a cap of 12 students per class to make it possible for the instructors to work closely with the students and to take account of individual differences in their backgrounds and learning styles.

This program is funded by the National Security Agency (NSA) and participation in this program is totally FREE; however, participation in all four semesters is required.
