CCV provides its participants with a unique opportunity to engage in a positive learning and leisure activity. Weekly classes provide participants with a social outlet in a new setting. By working collaboratively to learn and perform, the participants not only broaden their musical experiences but are able to further develop vocational and cognitive skills. CCV participants experience singing, chanting, movement, drumming, and playing rhythmic and tonal instruments. Our program philosophy is to make music in a supportive atmosphere where the reward is the pleasure of making music with others. Additionally, CCV unites its participants with the community through live performances. Participation is open to everyone in the community.

KCC Theater Program Coordinator and professor Brad Poer said "KCC Theatre is proud to present a truly unique take on Shakespeare's classic comedy about the insanity of love."

"In our version of the show, we asked what it would look like if it took place in a slightly magical version of 2022," Poer said, "complete with TikTok-inspired jokes, dances and lip synchs along with fairy characters who 'control' the humans in the story as if they were characters in a game of Dungeons & Dragons."

Poer called the dual in-person/virtual experience "simultaneously old-school and new-school." In-person seating will be placed onstage just in front of the actors for an intimate, "fly on the wall" experience, he said, with the actors focusing their performances on the 360-degree camera.

"Those in the theatre will get to watch the actors perform for the camera and view what the camera is broadcasting projected on a screen above the stage," Poer said. "It's the best of both digital and analog theatrical worlds!"

Every spring, KCC Art, Photography and Multimedia and Graphic Design program students from the current academic year are invited to submit up to four entries for consideration for Student Art Exhibition awards. Media categories include:

2D Fine Art (drawing, painting, printmaking and 2D mixed media)

3D Fine Art (ceramics, sculpture and 3D mixed media)

Digital Design (digital illustration and graphic design)

Photography (alternative print processes, black and white, digital and digital composite) Time-Based Digital Media (animation and video)

A faculty committee reviews and organizes all submissions and the bulk of the work is juried independently by an art professional chosen from outside of the College. The juror selects the major media category awards and honorable mentions, with cash prizes made possible through a generous donation made to the KCC Foundation by artist Kimiko Petersen and her husband Sherman Petersen. This year's juror is artist and art educator Donald W. VanAuken.

About the Juror

Originally from Michigan, Donald W. VanAuken's most current work in oil painting and printmaking deals with location and one's place within an environment. Having recently purchased a 1915

farmhouse in mid-Michigan, the artist and his wife have begun to explore this concept of "location" and its relationship to how and what one creates.

Artifacts from the past such as found photographs as well as encounters with native wildlife have spun into a narrative of this environment. Animals and relics of the past are often used as an allegorical means to describe situations, quandaries and everyday experiences that can describe a place.

As an art educator, VanAuken has served in secondary education, museum interpretation, as an adjunct professor of art and as a teaching associate with the School of Art at Ohio University, where he received his Master of Fine Arts degree in painting in 2007. He is currently a professor of art and visual arts talent director in the Visual Arts Program at Olivet College.
