It now draws members from ROI, the Kalamazoo Regional Education Service Agency's Young Adult Program (KRESA-YAP), McKercher Industries (MRC), and individuals from the greater Kalamazoo area. CCV provides its participants with a unique opportunity to engage in a positive learning and leisure activity. Weekly classes provide participants with a social outlet in a new setting. By working collaboratively to learn and perform, the participants not only broaden their musical experiences but are able to further develop vocational and cognitive skills. CCV participants experience singing, chanting, movement, drumming, and playing rhythmic and tonal instruments. Our program philosophy is to make music in a supportive atmosphere where the reward is the pleasure of making music with others. Additionally, CCV unites its participants with the community through live performances. Participation is open to everyone in the community.

Concentric Circles By Yang Lian

**Discussion Leader: TBA** 

From the publisher: Before and since his enforced exile, Yang Lian has been one of the most innovative and influential poets in China. Widely hailed in America and Europe as a highly individual voice in world literature, he has been translated into many languages. Yang Lian has written that *Concentric Circles* is '[my] most important piece since I came out from China', and it is emphatically not a political work, but instead a work focused on 'deep reality' and the nature of how humans understand that reality through the medium of language.

The book, like the sections of which it is comprised, uses a kind of collage, where many small fragments, each complete, are aligned together in a series of patterns to form a grander mosaic: from line to line, poem to poem, cycle to cycle, in ever-widening concentric structures. Yang Lian regards this English version as an integral part of the work as a whole – indeed, it could be said that the work is incomplete without its English parallel, and that as he reads it, he is 'struggling free from time and incorporated into the beautiful "concentric circles" of ancient and modern poetry, in China or elsewhere'.

Jervey Tervalon was born in New Orleans, Louisiana, and moved with his family as a young boy to the Jefferson Park/Crenshaw area of Los Angeles, California, the setting of many of his short stories and novels. The short story *Truth Comes Slowly* recounts an experience he had with gun violence, while visiting family members in San Francisco as a child with his mother.

Tervalon received his MFA in creative writing from UC Irvine studying with Thomas Keneally and Oakley Hall and was a Disney Screenwriting fellow and a Shanghai Writers Association fellow. His first novel *Understand This*, for which he won the 1994 New Voices Award from Quality Paper Books, was based on his experiences teaching at Locke High School. He has published five novels including the Los Angeles Times bestseller *Dead Above Ground*. He also edited *A Geography of Rage* on the 1994 uprising against police abuse. He coedited the *Cocaine Chronicles* and writes an ongoing series of memoir vignettes in the *LA Review of Books*. He is cofounder and literary director of Pasadena LitFest, the 2nd largest literary festival in California and the most diverse. and teaches fiction writing at the College of Creative Studies at UC Santa Barbara.

It's time to get the *Led* out and take a trip back to 1969! **Classic Albums Live** is bringing a note-for-note, cut-for-cut rendition of the **Led Zeppelin II** to the **Kalamazoo State Theatre** April 22!

Founded in 2003 by Craig Martin, Classic Albums Live takes the greatest albums and recreates them live on stage – note-for-note, cut-for-cut, using the best musicians. "Think of it as a recital," says Martin, "these albums are historic and stand the test of time." Forgoing costumes and impersonations, Classic Albums Live has found success in concentrating solely on the music. "We want the performance to sound exactly like the album," says Martin. Released in1969, Led Zeppelin II was the band's first album to hit No. 1 in the US, knocking The Beatles' Abbey Road (1969) twice from the top spot, where it remained for seven weeks. By April 1970, it had registered three million American sales. In Britain, the album enjoyed a 138-week residence on the LP chart, climbing to the top spot in February 1970. Meanwhile, Led Zeppelin II reached the top spot in other 5 national albums charts (including Canadian, Australian and Spanish albums charts).

The album also yielded Led Zeppelin's biggest hit, "Whole Lotta Love". This song reached No. 4 on the Billboard Hot 100 in January 1970. The single's B-side, "Living Loving Maid (She's Just a Woman)", also hit the Billboard chart, peaking at No. 65 in April 1970.

Every spring, KCC Art, Photography and Multimedia and Graphic Design program students from the current academic year are invited to submit up to four entries for consideration for Student Art Exhibition awards. Media categories include:

2D Fine Art (drawing, painting, printmaking and 2D mixed media)

3D Fine Art (ceramics, sculpture and 3D mixed media)

Digital Design (digital illustration and graphic design)

Photography (alternative print processes, black and white, digital and digital composite)

Time-Based Digital Media (animation and video)

A faculty committee reviews and organizes all submissions and the bulk of the work is juried independently by an art professional chosen from outside of the College. The juror selects the major media category awards and honorable mentions, with cash prizes made possible through a generous donation made to the KCC Foundation by artist Kimiko Petersen and her husband Sherman Petersen.

This year's juror is artist and art educator Donald W. VanAuken.

About the Juror

Originally from Michigan, Donald W. VanAuken's most current work in oil painting and printmaking deals with location and one's place within an environment. Having recently purchased a 1915 farmhouse in mid-Michigan, the artist and his wife have begun to explore this concept of "location" and its relationship to how and what one creates.

Artifacts from the past such as found photographs as well as encounters with native wildlife have spun into a narrative of this environment. Animals and relics of the past are often used as an allegorical means to describe situations, quandaries and everyday experiences that can describe a place.

As an art educator, VanAuken has served in secondary education, museum interpretation, as an adjunct professor of art and as a teaching associate with the School of Art at Ohio University, where he received his Master of Fine Arts degree in painting in 2007. He is currently a professor of art and visual arts talent director in the Visual Arts Program at Olivet College.
