The opening Black History Month reception will run from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. Monday, Jan. 31, in KCC's Morris Library, on campus at 450 North Ave. in Battle Creek. It will mark the launching point for Pugh's exhibit "Solo," as well as a month-long series of Black History Month events and activities at the College.

The opening reception and exhibit are free and open to the public, and light refreshments will be provided. The exhibit can be viewed during the library's open hours, which are 7:45 a.m. to 9 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays and 7:45 a.m. to 5 p.m. Fridays.

Pugh's exhibit will run through Feb. 28 and include more than a dozen large digital prints featuring his reoccurring original character Soul exploring his personality in a variety of environments and leading different lifestyles.

"These pictures represent different natures to which Soul can mold his self into," Pugh says of the character in an artist's statement. "By transcending through these phases he starts to understand who he is, but more importantly who he can become."

All works exhibited will be available for sale through the artist.

Pugh, a 2013 graduate of Battle Creek Central High School, is a well-known regional artist who has painted several public murals in the Battle Creek area, notably as part of annual Color the Creek events, and he's worked with KCC on a number of artistic endeavors over the past few years. His mural "Six Disciplines" was commissioned by KCC and installed on the south exterior wall of the Davidson Visual and Performing Arts Center in October 2019.

KCC's Morris Library will also host digital exhibits online at <u>kellogg.edu/library</u> as well as African American author displays and mini-exhibits in cases in the library on campus throughout the month of February.

Jerome and Delma Washington are the minds behind the art project Hidden Women of Color. This project is a series of portraits of African American women who lived between 1744-1996 who deserve to be seen for their achievements. These women, who include artist Edmonia Lewis and explorer Merze Tate, stepped out of their assigned roles and achieved great things despite the circumstances that surrounded them. The Washingtons will share their inspiration for this series, as well as discuss their love of history and art.

Jerome Washington started drawing as a child growing up in Albion, MI. He has worked in many artistic mediums, but his all-time favorites are pastels, pencil, and watercolors. Washington is known in his community as "the man who does sketches" and has a passion for drawing the joy children express. The Washingtons have become passionate about pursuing their interest in history, particularly African American history. Through this pursuit, they began to learn the stories of African American women who have become hidden through time. Delma Washington presented the idea that Jerome Washington should begin to draw these women as a way to bring recognition to them, and thus the Hidden Women of Color series was born. They currently reside in Albion, MI where they are pursuing their passions together.

A nationally recognized visual artist, she earned her BA from Western Illinois University and her MFA from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Buie has attended such Artist-in- Residency programs as the Joan Mitchell Center in New Orleans, LA; the Women's Studio Workshop in Rosendale, NY; and the Vermont Studio Center in Johnson, VT. She maintains a close connection to the community by hosting printmaking workshops and demonstrations, while participating in Healthy Neighborhood Initiatives through the production of public art created for underserved neighborhoods and communities in Milwaukee, and Madison, WI.

Buie has been a visiting artist lecturer in Tennessee, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Alabama, Wisconsin, Kansas, Missouri, Rhode Island, and Arizona, while continuing to exhibit her works in numerous juried, group and solo exhibitions throughout the country. Her extensive exhibition record includes The Contemporary Invitational Print and Drawing exhibition at the University of Hawaii at Hilo, The Haggerty Museum of Art, The Racine Art Museum, The Red Bull House of Art, N'NAMDI Center for Contemporary Art, the Urban Institute for Contemporary Arts, The Milwaukee Art Museum, The Madison Museum of Contemporary Art, The Museum of Contemporary Art Detroit, the Wriston Art Center, the Museum of Wisconsin Art, and the Alice Wilds.

Buie earned an emerging artist Mary L. Nohl Fellowship in 2012; the Love of Humanity Award from the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, and the prestigious Joan Mitchell Painters & Sculptors Grant in 2015; the 2019 Kresge Artist Fellowship in the Visual Arts; the 2019/2020 Grant Wood Fellowship in Printmaking at the University of Iowa in Iowa City, IA; and the 2020 Fellowship.art award, a top accelerator award and program funded through gener8tor. Buie's work has been acquired by major institutions and private collections nationally and reviewed on Hyperallergic.com and Essay'd.com
