The sons of Gregg Allman and Dickey Betts keep the musical legacy of their fathers alive with the **Allman Betts Band** taking the stage at the historic **Kalamazoo State Theatre** Wednesday, March 2, 2022! When The Allman Betts Band released Down to the River in June of 2019, the debut album represented not only the first time the group had recorded together, but, in fact, the first time the seven-piece ensemble had ever played together. If Down to the River was the sound of the band's combustible sparks igniting, then Bless Your Heart is their bonfire, built for the summer of 2020 and beyond; a double-album follow-up fueled by road-forged camaraderie and telepathic musical intensity, vibrantly reflecting the individual and collective experiences of these seven, all drawing inspiration from the band's symbolic hometown- a place Devon Allman calls "the United States of Americana." In 2019, as Down to the River topped charts and dotted playlists.

A conflagration of influences and invention, confidence and ambition, Bless Your Heart captures a vast, panoramic scope throughout a baker's dozen of modern rock. Ragged and stomping. Heady and frayed. Soaring and scorching. Generational and genteel. West Coast scenes and Gulf Coast shores. Gateways of the Midwest and swamplands of Florida. Wyoming's Big Sky. New York's Big Apple. Chicago's Broad Shoulders. Among the fiery set is "Magnolia Road," a semi-autobiographical overview of Allman and Betts written, ironically, by Vaughan alone, and a tie-dyed contender for summer festival favorite. There is the album's starter, "Pale Horse Rider," ominously evolving into a dark and dense rumbler accentuated by an unbridled storm of guitars, evoking the spirit of Neil Young's Crazy Horse and modern counterpart, My Morning Jacket. And "Ashes of My Lovers," a mourning motif of romance and wreckage, inflected with trail-dusted harmonica complementing the cinematic Badlands spook. Or "Airboats & Cocaine," with its tongue firmly in its cheek, telling the Southern Gothic tale of a girl born into the wrong family and her guy regretting his incidental associations with the underbelly of swampland contraband, wrapped up in a loose, mid-tempo stinger.

Get ready to celebrate a legendary album as Little Feat brings their *"Waiting for Columbus Tour"* to the Kalamazoo State Theatre Saturday, March 5, 2022!

Making a truly great live rock and roll album is an enormous challenge, so difficult that they are a rarity. *Waiting for Columbus* is a consensus member of that very exclusive club.

After two years of Covid-enforced silence, Little Feat has big plans for its return to the stage. Hard on the heels of their November "By Request" tour, they are planning a March-April 2022 tour that will celebrate the 45th anniversary of the legendary *Waiting for Columbus*, replicating the album at every stop.

Jerry Garcia once said that making a studio album was like building a ship in a bottle; with skill and oceans of patience, you could make something beautiful. But playing live and recording it was like being on a ship in a raging storm. Feat's trademark blend of California rock, funk, folk, jazz, country, rockabilly, and New Orleans swamp boogie rested on a base of improvisational skill and jazz-based chops that made their live shows special, and on *Columbus* those abilities are on triumphant display.

In August 1977, the band brought along a recording team to four shows in London and then three in Washington, D.C., and they captured sonic gold. Backed by the Tower of Power horn section, with whom they'd recorded *Feats Don't Fail Me Now*, they romped through extended versions of a stellar song selection that included "Fat Man in the Bathtub," "Spanish Moon," "Dixie Chicken", "Sailin' Shoes," and "Feats Don't Fail Me Now," as well as the iconic truck driver's lament, "Willin'," the song that got

Lowell out of the Mothers of Invention and gave birth to Little Feat. Generations of listeners have worn out the original vinyl, and the digital world will carry that heritage forward.

Hearing it again is something every Feat Fan looks forward to. It's time to lace up your dancing shoes. About **Ida Mae**: Hailing from Norfolk, U.K., Ida Mae are an acoustic alt-folk duo made up of husband and wife Chris Turpin and Stephanie Jean. Delivering romantic and atmospheric songs with resonant guitar and passionate vocals, the pair owe their influences to the sound of Americana and Deep South bluesrock. Their work can be heard on their 2019 debut LP, Chasing Lights.

The plot of this independent film, slated for a premiere in 2022, revolves around a pianist at an international competition and her struggles with the pressures of her art. Besides being in the film's climactic scene, the Philharmonia and stunning pianist <u>Natalia Kazaryan</u> also recorded the main piece of the soundtrack: Rachmaninoff's beloved 2nd Piano Concerto. This particular work was chosen for the movie because it was the first work of the composer after a long compositional drought brought on by bad reviews of his First Symphony, mirroring the struggles of the character herself. So while the Rachmaninoff followed a period of silence, the works on the first half preceded silence in some way: the towering (but ambiguous) passacaglia from Shostakovich's Lady Macbeth was the opera that resulted in his first Soviet censure, while Sibelius's searing, super-concentrated 7th Symphony, despite being written at the height of his powers, ended up being his last statement in the form. Sibelius could not bear the pressure of his success, burned the manuscript of a nearly complete 8th Symphony, and composed very little for the rest of his long life.

The opening Black History Month reception will run from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. Monday, Jan. 31, in KCC's Morris Library, on campus at 450 North Ave. in Battle Creek. It will mark the launching point for Pugh's exhibit "Solo," as well as a month-long series of Black History Month events and activities at the College. The opening reception and exhibit are free and open to the public, and light refreshments will be provided. The exhibit can be viewed during the library's open hours, which are 7:45 a.m. to 9 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays and 7:45 a.m. to 5 p.m. Fridays.

Pugh's exhibit will run through Feb. 28 and include more than a dozen large digital prints featuring his reoccurring original character Soul exploring his personality in a variety of environments and leading different lifestyles.

"These pictures represent different natures to which Soul can mold his self into," Pugh says of the character in an artist's statement. "By transcending through these phases he starts to understand who he is, but more importantly who he can become."

All works exhibited will be available for sale through the artist.

Pugh, a 2013 graduate of Battle Creek Central High School, is a well-known regional artist who has painted several public murals in the Battle Creek area, notably as part of annual Color the Creek events, and he's worked with KCC on a number of artistic endeavors over the past few years. His mural <u>"Six</u> <u>Disciplines"</u> was commissioned by KCC and installed on the south exterior wall of the Davidson Visual and Performing Arts Center in October 2019.

Park Street, Kalamazoo, MI 49007 Linling Lu: Musical Meditations is an exhibition of recent and new works that continues the artist's investigations and responses to sound and color. Inspired by various musical genres, such as Johann Sebastian Bach's cello suites and Japanese Taiko master Eitetsu Hayashi's drum piece, Fertility of the Sea, Lu channels these musical encounters, creating circular compositions that become physical manifestations of the music playing in her studio. This unique presentation of Lu's paintings can be considered individually, or in their entirety. Lu aims to fashion a space for viewers to explore while they imagine and consider their own physical and emotional responses to her works. At times the artist uses a monochromatic color palette, at others the artist's palette is a sharp contrast of seemingly discordant colors. Combined with these varying color palettes, Lu's use of the circular pictorial plane visualizes the resonant tones of varying musical influences, while also alluding to the cyclical nature of life, the multiplicity of humanity's place in the universe. The artist's paintings of varying sizes undulate and ripple with color, evoking their own vibrant score, encouraging reflection about sound, color, our bodies, and our very existence within the cosmos. Lu's colorful compositions ask viewers to consider and listen closely to themselves in order to find the score that lies within us all.

Linling Lu was born in 1983 in Guizhou (goo-zau) Province, China. In 2005 she received a bachelor's degree in Landscape Architecture from Beijing Forestry University. Lu came to the United States in 2006 to attend Maryland Institute College of Art (MICA), Baltimore, MD, received a BFA in painting in 2008 and an MFA from the Hoffberger School of Painting, MICA in 2011. Her work is included in private and public collections nationally and internationally and the permanent collection of the US Embassy in Beijing. The artist is represented by HEMPHILL Artworks.

Wilkins is the 2020-2022 selected recipient of Wellspring/Cori Terry & Dancers' Midwest Regional Alternative Dance Festival's (<u>RAD Fest</u>) RADicle residency award in partnership with <u>The Croft</u> of Horton Bay, MI. RADicle residency artists are awarded a two-week residency at the Croft where they create a work in the fall which premieres at RAD Fest in March.

"The Dance of Social Justice" is a lecture-demonstration which Wilkins has designed to be an introduction to his background and his journey of art and social justice practices leading to his RADicle project, <u>"The Conversation Series: Stitching the Geopolitical Quilt to Re-Body Belonging."</u> "The Conversation Series" culminates in a multi-media performance and is tailor-made to each and every community it is performed in. The Kalamazoo iteration will be presented at the Epic Center on March 4. Two weeks before the performance, Wilkins will bring together an intimate multi-cultural intergenerational grouping from the Kalamazoo community to illuminate the interstitial tissue that

connects us through shared stories, workshops, and local area historical cultural research. Wilkins will use this research to tailor-make the performance. This project will be completed in each of the 50 U.S. states with a documentary made of this process.
