She has had work accepted into juried Art shows and received awards, as well as having done commissioned pieces. Her work is available at the **Art on the Town Gallery** in Pentwater, MI.

Kay says, "I feel strongly that students who are interested in Art, and particularly in watercolor need to be exposed to the variety of materials and techniques available, and then have the opportunity to explore and decide for themselves what kind of result they wish to produce. Many Art teachers present students with a very narrow, mainly personal viewpoint with the expectation that the students' work will look like that of the teacher. My goal is for students to be confident in their ability and vision to explore on their own and create independently."

For younger children, we're offering our Rootead in Youth program, which meets once a week on Saturday mornings (Oct. 16 – Dec. 18) and includes instruction on movement, songs, rhythms, and storytelling centering on the African Diaspora. The program is a great primer for youth who'll move on to join the RYDC and RYDE programs, and it includes a showcase on Dec. 19 where participants can present what they've learned to their families and community.

As with all youth programming at Rootead, Social Emotional Learning (SEL) skills such as self-awareness, responsible decision-making, relationship skills, social awareness, and self-management are addressed throughout the program.

Program times are age-dependent, with 2-3-year-olds attending the 9:30-10 am class, 4-5-year-olds taking the 10 am -10:45 am class and 6-8-year-olds attending class from 11 am -11:45 am. She has worked with world-renowned percussionists, leads the band Dede and the Dreamers, and plays many solo/duo shows as the singing percussionist. Josh Holcomb spontaneously creates textures and sonic landscapes, transforming the acoustic five-string violin sound into an endless variety of tones. Originally from Kalamazoo, Josh studied music performance at the University of Michigan and Western Michigan University. He also studied Karnatic Music in Mysore, India, through the Vivekananda Institute for Youth Leadership.

Multimedia artist and Kellogg Community College alumnus Christopher Radford will exhibit nearly three dozen works of art at the College as part of his exhibit "In Pieces" in October.

The exhibit will run from Monday, Oct. 4, through Friday, Oct. 29, in the Eleanor R. and Robert A. DeVries Gallery of the Davidson Visual and Performing Arts Center, on campus at 450 North Ave. in

Battle Creek. The exhibit is free and open to the public for viewing during regular business hours, which are 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Mondays through Fridays.

A closing reception for the exhibit, also free and open to the public, will be held with the artist from 4 to 6 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 28, in the gallery.

The exhibit consists of collages, digital images, photographs and photograms heavily influenced by Radford's interest in the independent music scene, street culture and contemporary art.

"My work, whether photography, graphic design, minimalism or chaotic collage, is generally led by composition and color theory with a strong narrative that's not so obvious to everyone," Radford said. "At this time in my life I feel it is important for work to be informative, inquisitive and to inspire people to rethink social and systematic issues."

Radford graduated from KCC with an Associate of Applied Science in Photography and Multimedia in 2017 and went on to earn and a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Photography and Intermedia from Western Michigan University in 2019. He also earned a Bachelor of Aeronautics from Florida's Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in 2010.

In addition to working as an artist, Radford is an award-winning humanitarian who travels the world providing aid in natural disaster zones and war-torn countries. Now a full-time professional freelance artist and photographer, his current focus is on photographing the music industry and the art world. He also teaches video art production part-time at WMU.

Buie has attended such Artist-in- Residency programs as the Joan Mitchell Center in New Orleans, LA; the Women's Studio Workshop in Rosendale, NY; and the Vermont Studio Center in Johnson, VT. She maintains a close connection to the community by hosting printmaking workshops and demonstrations, while participating in Healthy Neighborhood Initiatives through the production of public art created for underserved neighborhoods and communities in Milwaukee, and Madison, WI.

Buie has been a visiting artist lecturer in Tennessee, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Alabama, Wisconsin, Kansas, Missouri, Rhode Island, and Arizona, while continuing to exhibit her works in numerous juried, group and solo exhibitions throughout the country. Her extensive exhibition record includes The Contemporary Invitational Print and Drawing exhibition at the University of Hawaii at Hilo, The Haggerty Museum of Art, The Racine Art Museum, The Red Bull House of Art, N'NAMDI Center for Contemporary Art, the Urban Institute for Contemporary Arts, The Milwaukee Art Museum, The Madison Museum of

Contemporary Art, The Museum of Contemporary Art Detroit, the Wriston Art Center, the Museum of Wisconsin Art, and the Alice Wilds.

Buie earned an emerging artist Mary L. Nohl Fellowship in 2012; the Love of Humanity Award from the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, and the prestigious Joan Mitchell Painters & Sculptors Grant in 2015; the 2019 Kresge Artist Fellowship in the Visual Arts; the 2019/2020 Grant Wood Fellowship in Printmaking at the University of Iowa in Iowa City, IA; and the 2020 Fellowship.art award, a top accelerator award and program funded through gener8tor. Buie's work has been acquired by major institutions and private collections nationally and reviewed on Hyperallergic.com and Essay'd.com
