Six years later, the devout family man is turning heads among fans and critics alike with albums full of soon-to-be-classics; 2021's tribute to the music that raised him, Stack of Records, and his aptly titled 2019 debut, Workin' Hard. Saving Country Music puts it simply: "If you're looking for the future of traditional country music, then look no further than...Larry Fleet." A road-tested live show standout, Fleet wrapped 2022 with his first-ever headline One For The Road Tour, following up crowd-winning opening slots in front of Darius Rucker, Willie Nelson, Jamey Johnson, Jon Pardi, and many more. He's touring now on his just-extended headline run, Larry Fleet Live, and will open tours for Pardi and Parker McCollum throughout the spring and summer.

Maria João Pires launched the Partitura Project in Belgium in 2012, with the aim to encourage cooperation and social engagement among pianists, and balance the dynamic between artists towards altruism rather than competitiveness. She will conclude her nine-day workshop for pianists with a solo and joint performance with her students. Program and participants will be announced from the stage. A piano master admired for her interpretations of Chopin, Schubert and Mozart, Pires is known for her lightness of touch and vital imagination. She has devoted herself to expressing the influence of art in life, community, and education. Reflecting on this philosophy, she has said "We have a responsibility to lead our life in the best possible way, to help others and to share this planet with compassion. Music and art are the deepest expressions of our soul and the direct transmission of our universe. I think everyone is born an artist and art should be shared with all people on this planet."

Born in 1944 in Lisbon, Pires gave her first performance at the age of four, and received Portugal's highest award for young musicians at the age of nine. She gained international recognition upon winning first prize at the Brussels Beethoven International Competition commemorating the composer's 200th birthday in 1970. Pires has appeared all over the globe with major orchestras including the Berliner Philharmoniker, the Boston Symphony Orchestra, the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, the London Philharmonic, the Orchestre de Paris, and the Wiener Philharmoniker.

The Connecting Chords Music Festival is proud to welcome Yale Strom & Hot Pstromi on Sunday, May 21 at 3:00 PM at Congregation of Moses, presenting a program of klezmer music "with a little horseradish on the side."

Violinist <u>Yale Strom</u> is one of the world's leading ethnographer-artists of klezmer and Romani music, known for his accomplishments as a composer, filmmaker, writer, photographer and playwright. Joining Strom will be members of his band Hot Pstromi: **Elizabeth Schwartz** (vocals/baritone ukelele) and **Amos Hoffman** (oud/guitar).

Elizabeth Schwartz has been called "The Edith Piaf of Yiddish" and "a revelation" with a superb mastery of klezmer ornamentations. In 2012, Schwartz was the first woman in history to sing at the 125-year-old Eldridge Street Synagogue in Manhattan, effectively breaking the ban of *kol isha* in this landmark cultural venue.

Amos Hoffman is an Israeli jazz guitarist and oudist known worldwide as a pioneer in fusing the rhythms and melodic themes of the Middle East with modern jazz. Hoffman was awarded one of Israel's most prestigious prizes in 2013: the Landau Prize for Arts and Sciences for Outstanding Achievement in the field of Jazz.
