The Neighborhood Journalist Network will showcase media coverage from a wide array of voices. More people, and more perspectives, means that news coverage will be more well-rounded and lift up more voices in the community.

Anyone interested in telling a story, and is ages 14+, is invited to become a Neighborhood Journalist for Public Media Network. Neighborhood Journalists will be trained with all the tools needed to be successful, including instructions in topics like: what makes a story newsworthy, interviewing strategies, writing basics, AP Style, event coverage, journalism ethics, video storytelling, cultural competency, and equipment basics. Neighborhood Journalists will go through a five-session virtual training period that is taking place once a week. Following this, Neighborhood Journalists are invited to a bi-weekly meeting led by PMN Journalist, Raine Kuch, and other PMN staff members. These meetings will give journalists the opportunity to collaborate with each other, get feedback on story ideas, and learn more about what is happening in the community.



He performed at David Bromberg's 70th Birthday Bash at NYC's Town Hall. In 2012, the Martin Guitar Company began selling the OM Jeff Daniels Custom Artist Edition Guitar. He also narrated the award-winning documentary, "The Ballad Of The Dreadnought."

"In 1976, I moved to New York City to become an actor. What I didn't plan on was being so influenced by so many Off Broadway playwrights. In particular, Lanford Wilson, who would later go on to win a Pulitzer Prize for his play TALLEY'S FOLLY. Lanford taught me so much about the writing process, imagery, the love/hate relationship one has with such a solitary pursuit and the endless rewriting as you search for a better way to say it. In Hollywood, the joke is if you ask any actor what he really wants to do, he'll say, "Direct." Not me. I wanted to write. So, I did. With a guitar in my hands."

"I first heard Lady In Satin in a mega-shopping mall somewhere in San Francisco. I was about 20 years old and didn't know much about Billie's records or her life or how her voice changed over the years. Anyway, the sound was coming from the other side of the mall and I remember mistaking her voice for a beautiful perfectly distorted electric guitar — some other-world thing floating there on this strange mournful ocean of strings and I was hooked for life.

Ten years later in 2006, I recorded an electric guitar instrumental version of "I'm A Fool To Want You" for my album Post-War. In 2018, I performed a concert in LA. with of all the songs from Lady In Satin as a quintet and began preparing guitar arrangements for the recordings compiled on this record — Think of Spring. The title comes from a poem written in 1924 by Jane Brown-Thompson that eventually became "I Get Along Without You Very Well" in 1938 — the first song here."

The conceit of Think of Spring is to filter the songs and strings from Lady In Satin through a single acoustic guitar using various alternate tunings and a minimal amount of textures and studio manipulation. Most of the songs were recorded on an analog Tascam four track.

Think of Spring is inspired by Billie Holiday, Ray Ellis, J.J. Johnson, John Fahey and Robert Johnson. Proceeds from this event will benefit Inner-City Arts & DonorsChoose via PLUS1 for Black Lives Fund. – M. Ward

Canada's Born Ruffians are known for their playful, high-energy brand of indie rock, marked by hooky guitar riffs, catchy pop melodies, and witty lyrics. It's a sound that draws upon the influence of classic altrock bands like Pixies and XTC with nods to contemporary acts like the Shins, OK Go, and the Strokes. The group emerged on the Toronto scene in the mid-2000s and have issued a steady flow of kinetic and inventive albums like 2008's Red, Yellow & Blue, 2013's Birthmarks, and 2018's Uncle, Duke & Chief.

Andrew Bird will reprise his annual "Gezelligheid" concerts this winter with a live stream performance on Sunday, December 13, 2020. Appropriating a Dutch term that loosely translates to "cozy," the Gezelligheid performances concentrate mainly on instrumental violin pieces amplified only by Bird's signature giant Victrola horns. Included with each ticket is an archival stream of the 2013 Gezelligheid performance, live from the Fourth Presbyterian Church in Chicago that will be available to view on or before the live stream on December 13.

Andrew Bird is an internationally acclaimed musician, songwriter, and composer who has released fifteen records to date. Recording and touring extensively, Bird has performed around the world at festivals and renowned institutions, including Carnegie Hall, Sydney Opera House, and Walt Disney Concert Hall. A TED Talks presenter, a New Yorker Festival guest, and an op-ed contributor for the New York Times, Bird debuted on the cast of Fargo's fourth installment on FX this fall. Bird's latest album, My Finest Work Yet, was nominated for "Best Folk Album" at the 2020 Grammy Awards.
