FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS IMPACT

At the Market, we saw \$1100 in purchases by customers using Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) (4 x the 2019 amount), and almost \$700 in purchases using Double-Up Food Bucks (2.5 x the 2019 amount). When you include SNAP and Double-up Food Buck purchases with WIC and Senior Project Fresh coupon purchases, the total food assistance purchases in 2020 was \$2,105.

ECONOMIC IMPACT \$120,000+

Based on anonymous sales data reported by participating vendors, EIFM vendor sales reached a minimum of \$80,000 in 2020, up 24% over 2019 reporting. Research by other farmers markets across the country indicates that market customers typically spend additional money in the community on market days, known as the 1.5x community economic multiplier. In the case of the EIFM, this equates to an approximate total economic impact to the community of \$120,000.


