In 1796, Edward Jenner administered the first smallpox vaccination to an 8-year-old boy. The boy recovered. 184 years later, in 1980, the World Health Organization declared smallpox eradicated, ending a 3,000-year scourge.

In 1985, one thousand people were stricken by polio every day across the world. That's 365,000 cases each year; most of them were children. 35 years later, only 10 cases of polio were reported in 2020. Rotary International played a major role in working towards the eradication of polio in conjunction with the World Health Organization, the United Nations, and the Gates Foundation. That partnership started with one small Rotary Club.

We have an opportunity to go from 184 years to 35 years to just a couple of years, through the miracle that is vaccination. But vaccination only works when people get vaccinated.
