- Place to pick up food and other necessities that are needed
- ❖ An easy place for people in the community to share with others
- ❖ Instant access to food
- ❖ A place to get food and be assured of anonymity
- ❖ 24/7 food source
- Located in a central spot for easy access

EFFECT. Membership understanding of the effect of the Blessing Box for community

- Has potential to cause resentment by others who meet food scarcity needs
- > Serves as an awareness to community of food scarcity needs
- Serves as an awareness to Rotarians of food scarcity needs.
- Has potential to be a "dumping ground" for items not wanted by others
- > Is easily available to all
- > Is seen in a positive light by the community
- Has good intentions.

QUESTIONS: Membership raised the following questions:

- √ Who uses it?
- √ Is it a liability?
- √ Is it meeting the needs of those who need it?
- ✓ Is it also serving "greedy" people who don't need it?
- √ Should there be a second location at the Food Bank?
- ✓ Should there be Rotary funding to provide for purchase of items when donations are low?

ISSUES: The following were mentioned as issues/problems to address:

- Uncontrollable stocking
- Dumping box
- Some take everything from box
- No signage
- Community is not aware of the Box
- Need a better drop off
- Signage to inform those who drop off what should be In Box.

Question 2: What should we do?

- Keep a SAFE source of emergency food to alleviate food needs, act as a stop gap to the Food Bank
- Provide information in the Box
- Continue to have it a quick and accessible source of food
- Promote Rotary more
- Raise Community Awareness to food needs
- Make it a consistent offering of quality food
- Have more food available
- Provide a list to community of items suitable to donate
- Make sure the food is nutritious
- Have organized, predictable involvement of Rotarians
- Have organized, predictable involvement of others in the community
- Put only appropriate shelf-life, stable food items
- Include toiletry items
- Include school supplies
- Partner deeper with the Church
- Partner deeper with Community
