Rotary Outbound Exchange provides students between the ages of 16 and 18 the opportunity of a lifetime! It's a chance to spend 11 months in another country learning the language and culture. Each year, about 15 boys and girls apply through their local Rotary Club and District 6400. Students generally apply in September and October to go on exchange the next year. Outbound students and their parents are guided through months of orientation and information about the country of their exchange year. Outbound students typically stay with two or three Rotary-approved families and receive a monthly stipend for incidental expenses.

Rotary Youth Exchange outbound students need to be above average students who are eager for the chance to try new things and meet new people. You will learn about other cultures, about other people and about yourself. Contact a Rotary Club today for more information.

Rotary Youth Exchange OUTBOUND Timeline:

- Apply for exchange July September 2015 for Exchange starting in August of 2016.
- Rotary Club Interviews student and parents in
 September/October 2015 and makes recommendation to Rotary District. Rotary District holds interviews of student and parents in late October/November.
- If Student is accepted into the program at the District level the student will need to complete a long form On-Line application that is sent to Central States Rotary Youth Exchange for processing and country assignment.
- Students find out their Country Assignment in January/February 2016.
- Training for parents and students starts in January/February
 2016 and concludes with a the weekend long Central States Conference at Calvin College in Grand Rapids in July of 2016.
- Students leave on Exchange in late August of 2016 to return in June/July of 2017.

The cost of the program is approximately \$2,800 plus the cost of a round trip one change allowed airline ticket. FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES INFORMATION SHEET

The various fees for an Outbound Rotary Youth Exchange Student are listed on this page. It should be noted that participating host countries may make changes that may require additional costs which may not be listed here. Some of those costs could include a language camp upon arrival in the host country as an example. District 6400 makes every effort to stay current with any anticipated costs. All fees listed here are to be paid in U.S. Funds.

• **APPLICATION FEE** – To accompany the application (U.S. Funds) \$50.00 The Application Fee is non-refundable and covers initial processing of application and District Interview Fees.

DISTRICT 6400 FEES –

- May be paid as outlined or in full at the first due date (U.S. Funds) \$2,950*
- These fees cover the cost of a variety of supplies and required training for both the student and the student's parents. Fees are limited to the following:
 - Central States Rotary Youth Exchange Required Health Insurance* The Price of required insurance may affect the overall cost of the program. This is based on current rates for insurance.
 - Rotary Youth Exchange Blazer
 - Administrative Costs including Central States Rotary Youth Exchange processing
 - District Orientation for Student and Parents as well as a student only session
 - Weekend Orientation for Student & Parents at Calvin College in Grand Rapids (July 2016) as a part of the Central States Rotary Youth Exchange Conference.
 - Various supplies such as Business Cards and name badge
 - Students in good standing and one parent have the option of attending the Central States Conference as a "Rebounder" in July 2017. Other attendees at cost.

OTHER EXPENSES THAT CAN BE ANTICIPATED –

- Round Trip "one change allowed" Airline Ticket and MUST be purchased through Rotary Approved Travel Agency.
- A \$500 U.S. Funds "Emergency Fund" must be maintained by the student during their exchange year. Generally, the
 host club holds the money until the student returns. This covers possible medical deductibles or other emergency
 expenses.
- Student will need to purchase their own personal products, such as toothpaste, shampoo and clothing.
- Rotary offers a number of "See the Country" trips and students have the opportunity to travel with other exchange students to see their host country. Costs for this trip are determined by the host Rotary Clubs.
- Any additional insurance, language orientation camps that may be particular to the host country.

DISTRCIT 6400 FEE PAYMENT SCHEDULE –

- Payment must be made on or before of each of the following dates: (any refunds after November 23rd payment are subject to a \$100 processing fee/November Payment is non-refundable)
 - November 20, 2015 for Primary (two weeks after notification of moving to Primary for any secondary list students) \$500 (Non-Refundable)
 - January 1, 2016 \$500
 - February 1, 2016 \$650
 - Final payment of \$1,300 is due on or before March 1, 2016
