District 6450 is able to fund one or more local Global Grants that serve our communities. These will be collaborative projects that multiple clubs will join together to complete, either District-wide or in clusters of Clubs.

Global grants support activities in one of Rotary's **areas of focus**.

- Peacebuilding and conflict prevention
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water, sanitation, and hygiene
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Community economic development
- Environment

We are looking for projects within our District that provide **sustainable, measurable outcomes** that address **real community needs**. Think about the impact you want to make in the community and set a main goal within the area you have chosen.

To be considered for funding, a project **MUST**:

- Have a long-term, sustainable impact
- Include activities that align with the goals of one of Rotary's areas of focus
- Have a minimum budget of \$30,000
- Address an important need identified by the community
- Strengthen the community's capacity to address its own needs
- Propose Clubs working together to complete the project

Sustainability means providing long-term solutions to community problems that community members themselves can support after grant funding ends.

Collaborating with another organization can enhance the quality and effectiveness of a grant project. A cooperating organization can provide technical expertise, advocacy, training, education, or other support. List any organization you think would be a partner on the project.

Measurable Outcomes: When you measure your success, you can show that you made a difference. A good global grant plans for a measurable outcome when the project is completed.
