Interestingly it was a member of the Rotary Club of Naperville - **Prakash Tata** – who suggested that Srini choose our Club. Srini was sponsored by **Geoff Roehll** and immediately threw himself into Club projects, earning him the 2020-2021 Rookie of the Year honor.

In his installation address Thursday, Srini attributed our Club's success to "strong leadership," "great fellowship," and a willingness to pitch in and help each other. It was that fellowship, he said, that kept him from freezing to death during our 2022 5K event.

Srini admitted that when he was offered the presidency, he was "humbled" and wondered, "what did I sign up for?" He said he would welcome "armchair" advice during his presidency.




Member Matters
