Ashley Schreck, Director of Marketing, EP!C Update on Murray Baker Bridge Lighting



Ashley Schreck, Director of Marketing at EP!C, brought the Club up to date from her previous presentation two years ago concerning the "Light It Up" project, an initiative of Chuck Weaver's 1000 Pound Project campaign. Ashley and a group of several volunteers spearheaded a drive

to re-light the Murray Baker Bridge from when it went dark in 2012 due to cost of replacing bulbs and other maintenance of the lighting, originally installed in 1991. 2020 was a perfect time to install new

lights since the Bridge would be shut down for rehabilitation. The five million cost to do so was procured from an Illinois grant specifically designated only for bridge work. Several local companies were awarded contracts to light the Bridge. For example, Parsons manufactured the casings for the bulbs and Oberlander Electric and Laser Electric were involved in the lighting installation.



The "Light It Up" volunteers have turned over their work to the City of Peoria which is designated by IDOT to manage the Bridge. Other stakeholders besides the City of Peoria are Peoria County, the City of East Peoria, and Tazewell County. The current estimate for sustaining the lighting project is \$70K annually. That pays for maintenance, staffing (to operate the lighting changes and light shows), utilities, and someday, perhaps other beautification efforts.



On Halloween, 2020, the 500 full-spectrum LED bulbs were switched on. Since that time, several groups have showed interest in paying a fee to make a special lighting request to light the bridge in specific color combinations to celebrate or draw attention to their cause or event. Soon information for sponsoring a light display will be found on their Facebook page and website at LIGHT IT UP!


Volunteer Opportunities
