The Process, Trials & Tribulations of Inventing, Manufacturing & Distributing Toys / Games in the Heartland



John Hinnen's message to Peoria Rotarians on Friday last was: "Don't give up, it's never too late". John is the owner of Sundawg Design, a local man who makes games and toys. John Hinnen says he began thinking about inventions when he was young. A solar hot dog cooker is one example. He designed that in 1979. What he didn't do was get a patent on it.

A discovery box for children was created in 1984. The problem was he was the only one putting them together. John got a "temporary" job at Diamond Star Motors in Normal....and stayed there for the next 26 years. But during that time, he was also filling notebooks with ideas.



When Diamond Star closed in 2015, John resumed inventing, creating the "Bandit Ball", which can take three different shapes, and "Holiday Circle Cards", a deck with different suits and original card games. You can see more about these items at Sundawg Design's website: https://sundawgdesign.com
