Dr. Barry Clemson, Medical Co-Director of Heart Transplant **OSF Heart Transplant Program Updates**





Dr. Barry Clemson, Heart Failure Medical Director for OSF HealthCare Cardiovascular Institute told Peoria Rotarians about the resumption of transplants at OSF St. Francis Medical Center. The patient, 24-year-old Mendota resident John Wlodarchak, thought he had COVID-19 when he first went to the hospital. Instead, it was the beginning stages of heart failure, early this year Wlodarchak became the first person to get a transplanted heart at OSF since 2007.

Dr. Clemson said the program had been suspended in 2007 because smaller facilities were doing fewer transplant procedures, and it was thought transplant surgery might better be a specialty of larger medical centers. Now the transplant program is back at OSF because of several factors. The number

of transplants is increasing because the number of donor hearts has increased - unfortunately due to the number of opioid-related deaths. In addition, the survival rate for transplant patients is rising.

Finally, Dr. Clemson said the mission is to provide a local option so that people living in central Illinois do not have to travel to Chicago, St. Louis, or Indianapolis for a procedure that could take several months to happen. OSF St. Francis is the only Illinois hospital outside of these major cities providing this service.

Clemson estimates that in the future an upward of 40 heart

transplants a year could be performed at the OSF HealthCare Cardiovascular Institute. Two successful surgeries have already been done this year, including Wlodarchak and another patient shortly afterward. There are also several patients waiting for the call to let them know that a heart is available and they will be the next recipient undergoing a heart transplant surgery.
