Veterans Day Program Colonel Dan McDonough "A Typical Day: Deployed"

The Commander of the 182nd Airlift Wing talked to Peoria Rotarians about "a typical day deployed" as the speaker for the Rotary's Veteran's Day program. As it turns out, there is no such thing as a typical day. Col. Dan McDonough took over command of the 182nd in November 2017 from now- General Robbie Roberson.



As Col. McDonough tells it, the 182nd Airlift's men and women have been at work at a variety of missions, both in combat and in peacetime. The Wing's C-130H Hercules cargo planes have been used in the battle against Covid-19. Two C-130 crews flew to Eugene, Oregon to pick up medial isolation pods which were flown to Chicago for use in an alternative medical facility.



That mission was one of many recent missions that seemingly fall outside the normal job of the Airlift Wing but were taken up and performed by the men and women of the 182nd Airlift Wing.

Our region has entered a phase of mitigation as a response to the COVID-19 resurgence. 


So You Thought You Knew Bill Harlan (In 200 Words or Less!) By Edie Barnard
