Banu Hatfield, Co-Owner of Zion Coffee Bar Private / Public Collaboration to Serve Peoria's Homeless Population

One of the co-owners of Zion Coffee in Peoria – Banu Hatfield - told Peoria Rotarians about her work with the homeless population of Peoria, and some of the lessons she has learned.

She says that beginning in June of last year, she and her husband Mike learned about four homeless men who were displaced and now living in a lot around Zion Coffee. The Banfield's desire to help blossomed into a fundraiser which brought in \$17,000 in a short time.



Partnering with The Dream Center of Peoria and JOLT, Banu learned about what the Peoria homeless population needed and did not need. That included inappropriate clothes, food which needed refrigeration and even some donated DVD's.

Banu says one lesson she learned was the importance of teamwork with other organizations and not trying to reinvent the wheel. Meanwhile, Banu says one of the first ways to help the homeless – portable showers – will likely become a reality in 2021.

Blue Duck is open for carry-out curbside, catering or delivery. We love their ribs and pulled pork and people rave about their barbecued wings. Plus, you get a roll of toilet paper with every \$30 order!
