
Jenn Gordon, ArtsPartners of Central Illinois

Building Awareness and Strengthen the Arts for Economic and Cultural Enrichment of Central IL



On Friday, November 20th, Peoria Rotarians learned about ArtsPartners of Central Illinois. Jenn Gordon, the head of the program told Rotarians what her group has been doing in these days of COVID-19 and reduced attendance at gatherings. Gordon, who has been with ArtsPartners since 2016, helped coordinate the effort by arts organizations to get funds though the government's "CARES" Act".

That meant finding out how and how much might be available to the many arts organizations in this area. In fact, Jenn Gordon says the arts and arts organizations employ some 850 people locally and have a budget of over twenty million dollars. But, Gordon says, COVID-19 has hit the arts and artists hard. A survey shows some 13-percent of the arts organizations are not confident they will survive the pandemic.

So You Thought You Knew how The GREEN LIGHT received its Name (In 200 Words or Less!) By Edie Barnard

No one knows why our Rotary newsletter is called "The Greenlight." Perhaps the "green light" at the end of the pier in "The Great Gatsby" inspired the name. Even the amazing Naomi Schaefer who was our club's executive secretary from 1944-1990 doesn't know! Below are thoughts from some of our members.

<u>Bill Albers</u>- Maybe it refers to traffic lights. Green is the OK to go forward - a good motto for Rotarians.

Rich Zuckerman provides two possible answers: The Green Light was named in honor of the Green Lantern who was a superhero created in 1940. As with all superheroes, he lived by the superhero 4-way test to protect regular folks from Villainy. As with Rotary-Service to others was the #1 directive of the Green Lantern. Or..........

The Green Light derives from the history of the Downtown Rotary as always moving forward and not stopping in providing service to the community. It is a positive affirmation that our newsletter will communicate information and stories on the membership and the Club that show that we are on the go and not to be stopped.

Kate Schureman-Perhaps the use of the green light started in the late 1800's with American railroads. A green light on a track meant that a train had, "permission to proceed." According to the History of District 6460, the Peoria Rotary, along with Peoria itself, has a railroading history. The first in District 6460 was our Peoria Club as Number 73 on July 1, 1913. The story often told about the formation of the club was that a group of Rotarians from Chicago came to Peoria on the train and set about the process of recruiting members for a Rotary Club. So maybe, the Green Light is how we are receive our instructions to "proceed" via the newsletter.
