
Stephanie Coad and Doug Roelfs - CityLink Maintenance and Operations Admin Building (Phase B) Construction Project Update



Peoria Rotarians learned a lot about the Greater Peoria Mass GTransit District's operations last Friday. For example, how much things cost. The three new electric buses cost the Peoria District about one million dollars each. The buses were manufactured by Proterra and funded by a federal grant and lawsuit settlement. What about the employee

numbers? There's 175 of them. How about ridership? According to, Doug Roelfs, the Citylink General Manager, that's down. But, according to records from the mass transit district, in 2021, the system still had a total ridership of 1,607,100, or about 4,500 every weekday.

What's the budget for mass transit in Central Illinois? For CityLink, it will come to a total of 88 million, 160-thousand dollars for 2023. According to Doug Roelfs, the federal government gave CityLink a good deal of money, and they have to spend it in five years. The problem is, as Doug explained it, "it takes about three years to get a bus. So, we're concerned about how fast we're able to spend some of this money that we have". Roelfs says he hopes to have several more electric buses within that time frame.



Rotarians also heard about the construction work on the Mass Transit Center from Stephanie Coad, Project Manager at Muller2. Work started in



April of last year, and already the repainting shop is almost finished. It's hoped that a solar panel array can be added to the top of the "bus barn" to allow the electric buses to be recharged. The reconstruction of the buildings on Jefferson Street will cost some 70-million-dollars in federal and state funds.


