Lindsey Kerr, Executive Director - Lifeline Pilots of Illinois



The Lifeline Pilots Organization's purpose is to offer free travel-through volunteer pilots—to financially distressed people with medical or humanitarian needs far from home. The Lifeline Pilots vision statement is shorter and to the point; "The shortest distance between home and hope".

Lifeline Pilots Executive Director Lindsey Kerr spoke to Rotarians on Friday, telling the members how the volunteer pilots have flown millions of miles over nine-thousand separate missions throughout ten states of the Midwest and upper South.

Interestingly, most of the money to operate the organization comes from the pilots themselves. Only about 30-percent of the budget comes from donations, fundraising and grants.

While Lifeline is headquartered in Peoria, there are hundreds of the volunteer pilots scattered around the ten-state area served by Lifeline. By using small private aircraft, Lifeline is able to serve patients who don't live close to a major airport. Some Lifeline passengers –undergoing medical care—have been flown repeatedly by the same pilot.

Lindsey Kerr may have surprised some people when she didn't ask for donations for her organization, She DID ask for Rotarians to spread the word about the free service for medical and humanitarian needs. Lindsey said Lifeline could double the number of its clients if only more people knew about their service.

Michael (Mike) J. Kelley June 21, 1947 - January 21, 2022

Michael J. Kelley, 74, of East Peoria, passed away on January 21, 2022, at Unity Point Methodist Hospital in Peoria. He was born in Bloomington, IL on June 21, 1947.

Mike was a member of the Rotary Club for 38 years. "Mike truly represents the ideals and selfless volunteering Tom Connor himself practiced and for which he was honored with this distinguished community award bestowed on others in his name. Mike is not a highly visible local "personality" nor does he wield great financial resources or political weight but, to a person who has had the privilege and honor to work with and alongside Mike, they will tell you that they would give him the shirt off their back if he asked them to because he would do the same for them in a heartbeat."

"Even as he faced enormous challenges and pain in his fight to battle the cancer that threatened his life in 2012, Mike was thinking of others and calling people to help him cover his volunteer commitments in his time of great need." donated by the Club, he encourages attendees to continue their efforts to
re-integrate into the community. Homeless veterans from 22 surrounding
communities take part in the program to help both physically and mentally.

His spirit of giving is truly amazing and an inspiration to all who know

Experienced Rotary leaders within our District will serve as faculty members for this training.



Mike Kelley is celebrating his Cancer Rebirth this month!

He says that he has loved being a Rotarian from day one, and that the support from his Rotary friends has been an important part of his healing. With his jaunty smile and quick sense of humor, he is a positive force in any group of people. Mike is a Power of Example of knowing that having a positive attitude can carry him through unforeseen challenges. Whether he is making others laugh while he was being prepped to receive donated stem cells (see pic) or learning to walk after the process was completed (see pic), he is an inspiration to us all. Below he shares more.





"I joined Rotary in 1984 to network with local business leaders and give back to the community through community service. What I didn't think of then was that I have received so much more from my involvement in Rotary than I have given. It is impossible to quantify the deep friendships made here. I have loved working with others on many projects. Some of my favorites were several years with Christmas In April, Tee It Up For The Troops, the cleanup of the public lots at Springdale Cemetery, and building the rock climbing wall on the children's playground at the

When I was diagnosed with Stage 4 Lymphoma and Gillian Barre Syndrome 4 ½ years ago, my life was immediately turned upside

down. My Rotary friends rallied around me and supported me from day one. There were stacks of get well wishes, phone calls and visits. When it was determined that I needed a Stem Cell Transplant at Loyola and would need to live in that area for 3 months, generous monetary contributions came in the mail to help with expenses. Your continuing support certainly helped make our stay away from home and my recovery easier and we are grateful. It has been a long and bumpy road but my Rotary friends never allowed me to feel I was alone. You have generously bestowed upon me two Paul Harris Fellow Awards. Both were given anonymously. You also submitted me to receive the Tom Connor Award for community service (see pic with wife Linda after receiving the award.) I am grateful to be returning to my wonderful Rotary activities."
