Weekly Meeting at The Warehouse on State Friday, February 2, 2024 at 12:00PM Speaker: Ray Lees, Tri-County Regional Planning Commission Topic: Finally open! The Bob Michel Bridge Story

Our Rotary speaker last Friday was Jennifer Zammuto who leads the <u>Heart of Illinois United Wav</u>, one of our community's most unique nonprofit organizations. Jennifer shared with us that the Heart of Illinois United Way is the largest non-governmental funder of health and human care programs in central Illinois. The money it raises stays in the community, funding programs in Marshall, Peoria, Putnam, Stark, Tazewell and Woodford counties.

Jennifer states that, "We came into existence about a hundred years ago and the whole purpose was so that you, companies, and other individuals did not have to be solicited by 45 different nonprofits every time they needed something. We are very collaborative."

> Jennifer's noteworthy sense of humor was in play when she said, "If you really love McDonald's, that doesn't mean that their stock is necessarily the right one in your portfolio just because you like their French fries!" Our speaker, who began her career as an expert in

international exports and marketing, continued, "You've got to look at your overall goals and at which stocks will get you where you need to go.

"Heart of Illinois United Way does the same thing for your charitable investment. We look under the hood for you. We do it once every 3 years because it takes us that long to pull all the data.
"The primary focus of the 2023 Heart of Illinois United Way Community Assessment is to improve the organization's effectiveness in identifying, assessing, and supporting key areas of social concern related to the education, financial stability, and health of all people in central Illinois.
"This information helps us. As we're starting a new three-year cycle of funding at the Heart of Illinois United Way, we're going to be funding more mental health programs." (With one of the themes of Rotary International being mental health, we in the audience were happy to hear this.)
This assessment is integral to the Heart of Illinois United Way's data-driven process to prioritize

and address community needs through program indicators and measurable outcomes. The Heart of Illinois United Way then collaborates with partner agencies and a wide variety of community partners to address critical needs.

We Rotarians took away important information from Jennifer's talk, including the advice to "Follow your heart, trust the data and invest in your community." *Article Written By: Edith Barnard*

Rotary FOUNDATION MINUTE - VOCATIONAL TRAINING TEAMS

CREATE HOPE

A vocational training team (VTT) offers a hands-on approach to vocational service. In VTTs, groups of professionals travel either to learn more about their vocation or to teach local professionals about a particular field. A VTT helps create sustainable change by strengthening the knowledge and skills of individuals and communities, thereby improving their capacity to serve. In addition to experiencing a new culture and fostering global connections, Rotarians participating in a vocational training team have the opportunity to make an impact long after their travels end.

Teams can qualify for a global grant through The Rotary Foundation so long as they address one of Rotary's six areas of focus and follow certain specific guidelines for scope sustainability and measurability. Funded teams must consist of at least one Rotarian team leader with general Rotary knowledge, leadership skills, international experience, and expertise in the area of focus; and at least two other participants (Rotarians or non-Rotarians) with two years of work experience in the area of focus.
