Ben Blumenberg

Rotary's speaker for Friday was Ben Blumenberg, CEO of W. D. Boyce Boy Scouts of America Council locally. He took on that role in 2022. A Boy Scout and Eagle Scout as a young man, Blumenberg has been employed by the BSA since graduating from college.

Scouts in the Peoria area belong to the W.D. Boyce BSA Council. So, who was W. D. Boyce, and why was a 14-county region in Central Illinois named for him? Well, William D. Boyce was a Chicago publisher from Rockford, who incorporated the Boy Scouts of America in 1910. That came after meeting Robert Baden-Powell,

who had founded the scouting movement in England.

Ben Blumenberg says the role of Scouting in a young person's life is a means to develop them into being leaders. In Ben's words, "to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the scout oath and law to be trustworthy and loyal and that doing Community Service is also a great part of the Scout life". "Scouting", Blumenberg said, "is a game with a

purpose. Kids join for fun; they join for the outdoors. But it's different than most things kids do".

The Scouting movement in America is currently led

by Roger Krone, a retired businessman and Eagle Scout, was named in 2023 as the new chief executive of the organization. Scouting's 114th anniversary was Thursday. By the way, Ben Blumenberg has also indicated he plans to join the Rotary Club of Peoria.

The Peace Corps and Rotary have a partnership agreement that started in 2015, inspired by a group of Returning Peace Corps Volunteers. The heart of the agreement is that Peace Corps and Rotary have almost identical focuses. Partnering for Peace is committed to developing that partnership agreement at the grass roots level. The organization's vision is to help Rotarians, current international service volunteers and returned international service volunteers of various countries, to work together on projects that are consistent with the goals of both Rotary and such organizations. Through this collaboration former Peace Corps volunteers, through Rotary clubs, can continue their international humanitarian service in the local villages and towns where they served.

Partnering for Peace, by using our connections, and working through our clubs, hopes to identify former Peace Corps volunteers and their families and the countries where they served. This collaboration will nurture local projects in the volunteer's former communities, working with the local Rotary Club. These networking activities between Peace Corps families in the US and Rotary clubs, and the offshore Rotary clubs has already resulted in projects benefiting the offshore communities.
