Christa Staley, the new Executive Director of the Midwest Food Bank was on hand Friday to give Peoria Rotarians an update on how her

organization has expanded since it began in Illinois over twenty years ago.

The Midwest Food Bank serves not-for-profit organizations such as food pantries, soup kitchens, homeless shelters, churches, and other non-profit organizations helping their community. Multiple locations across the globe now allow many non-profit organizations and their volunteers to take part in daily food bank operations and scheduled distributions.

The Midwest Food Bank depends on volunteers. Peoria Rotarians have helped at the Food Bank offices in northern Peoria on more than one

occasion. There have been some 30,000 volunteers worldwide! That's 500 volunteers for each staff member. The Peoria facility sees 35-hundred volunteers annually. But Peoria has only six full-time staff members.

Staley says The Midwest Food Bank is now active in 23 states as well as Africa and Haiti. And last year, Midwest Food Bank was able to partner with Amazon to provide food boxes

containing fresh produce, shelf-stable





foods, and multiple meals to serve just under 1000 people in a very poverty-stricken area in Kentucky. In 2023, the Midwest Food Bank distributed 32 million dollars' worth of food to different 350 agencies who help to feed the needy.

FOUNDATION MINUTE - ROTARY PEACE FELLOWS 2



In September, I shared what a Rotary Peace Fellowship was. As a reminder, each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fully funded fellowships for dedicated leaders from around the world to study at one of our peace centers. Through academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities, the Rotary Peace Centers program develops the capacity of peace and development professionals or practitioners to become experienced and effective catalysts for peace. The fellowships cover tuition and fees, room & board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses.

Since the program began in 2002, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained more than 1,600 fellows who now work in more than 115 countries. Many serve as leaders in governments, Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), the military, education, law enforcement, and international organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank. The Rotary Peace Fellowship is designed for leaders with work experience in peace and development. Our fellows are committed to community and international service and the pursuit of peace. Each year, The Rotary Foundation awards up to 50 fellowships for master's degrees and 80 for certificate studies at premier universities.

I wanted to share this again, because applications are currently open for the Rotary Peace Fellowships. Candidates have until May 15, 2024 to submit applications to The Rotary Foundation.
