**Principal Arnold Spiker** 

Last Friday, Woodruff Career and Technical Center Principal Arnold Spiker was our guest speaker. Mr. Spiker has a 31-year career in education as a math teacher, athletic director, assistant coach, head coach, and assistant principal.

Woodruff changed from a regular high school to a technical school in 2011. According to its mission statement, Woodruff offers every student "an enriched and challenging learning environment, diverse programs, and focused education on technology and workplace expectations."

Students can take courses in everything from auto body repair and construction to criminal justice or cosmetology and renewable energy. That renewable energy program got a boost a couple of years ago when two million dollars from the Edwards

Power Plant settlement was used to install solar panels at Woodruff, as well as purchase equipment for the solar program's courses.



The Woodruff Career & Technical Center (WCTC)

Students are bussed to Woodruff from Manual, Central and Richwoods High school for their technical classes, and returned to home schools for their core curriculum classes. Principal Spiker says plans are to have those core classes, such as reading and math, available at Woodruff as well, eliminating bus travel time.

Instructors at Woodruff are professionals in the subjects

they teach. The 376 students are mostly Juniors and Seniors. Mr. Spiker says getting a technical education at Woodruff not only allows students to get an early look at a career, it allows them to do so cheaper than taking postgraduate training. And, he says, students are not just learning technical skills at Woodruff. "Our career coaches work with them on employability skills, work with them on writing resumes, and work with them on mock interviews". Students spend time at actual job sites and factories--if they meet the criteria:

"One, the kids have to show they have the skills Second, they have to show that by their attendance (at work). And the third one is they have to be mature enough to handle constructive criticism".

This year's Sterling Merit Awards Banquet will be held on May 7, 2024, at the Peoria Civic Center Ballroom.

The Keynote Speaker will be Nikki Romain - Co-founder for Artists ReEnvisioning Tomorrow (ART, Inc)

The annual banquet will host students and their parents from the following area schools: Brimfield, Dunlap, East Peoria, Elmwood, Farmington, Illini Bluffs, Illinois Valley, Limestone, Manual, Peoria Notre Dame, Peoria Heights, Peoria, Princeville, Quest Academy and Richwoods High Schools.

We anticipate 650 plus in attendance. We honor the top eight percent of high school graduates who have attained the highest standing in their classes. The Sterling Merit Awards Banquet gives public recognition to students who have excelled academically during their high school years.

Last year 170 students qualified for the award and 153 attended the banquet, accompanied administrators from each school and by parents and/or other family members. This is a very meaningful event for students and their families, and our club has enthusiastically co-sponsored the event for over 50 years.

Students attend the banquet free of charge. Family members are asked to pay \$20.00 which is well below cost, and this year includes free parking. For the past several years, we have offered opportunities for sponsorship to partially defray the costs of the event and to keep charges within a reasonable range for our families.

# Rotary Kotary FOUNDATION MINUTE - WATER, SANITATION, & HYGIENE MONTH



### March is designated as Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Month

Rotary supports activities that encourage the management and protection of freshwater resources and provide universal and equitable access to safe drinking water, sanitation, and hygiene. The Rotary Foundation seeks to empower governments, institutions, and communities to manage their water, sanitation, and hygiene services through environmentally sound, measurable, and sustainable interventions.

Rotarians are encouraged to ensure communities' sustainable access to water, sanitation, & hygiene by:

- 1. Facilitating universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water.
- 2. Improving water quality by protecting and maintaining surface and groundwater resources, reducing pollution and contaminants, and promoting wastewater reuse.
- 3. Facilitating universal and equitable access to improved sanitation and waste management services in order to achieve open defecation-free communities.
- 4. Improving community hygiene knowledge, behaviors, and practices that help prevent the spread of disease.
- 5. Strengthening the capacity of governments, institutions, and communities to develop, finance, manage, and maintain sustainable water and sanitation services.
  - 6. Funding graduate scholarships for career-minded professionals related to water, sanitation, and hygiene.
