Blumenthal Scholarship Awards

I think it's important that the students here, our newest members of rotary, and all of us realize what the Blumenthal scholarships mean. And they mean several complementary things!



This is a picture of ruth Blumenthal and her children, albert aged two and a half and Marion, just six months. The year is 1935. The place is Nazi Germany. The Blumenthal's are Jewish. Ruth, Walter, and the children managed to escape to holland. Holland was then occupied by the Nazis. For six and a half years the Blumenthal's were forced to live in

concentration camps including the notorious Bergen-Belsen.

On April 23rd, 1945, the train carrying the Blumenthal's was liberated by Russian

troops. Walter Blumenthal succumbed to typhus just after liberation. Eventually, after much hardship, the three surviving members of the Blumenthal family came to America. The Jewish community of Peoria, Illinois had offered them somewhere to live. The date was April 23rd, 1948...three years to the day after their liberation. Marion -13 and Albert -15 went to Peoria central high school.




Even knowing little English to begin with, they graduated with their class. Their mother worked as a seamstress.



Marion Blumenthal, in the years to come, became a passionate spokesperson for the survivors of the Nazi holocaust. She wrote this book -Four Perfect Pebbles and she has been telling her family's story of survival ever since.

At 86 years old, Marion Blumenthal is still giving her speeches. And what about albert Blumenthal, her older brother? After graduating from Peoria central high school in 1951, albert was given a



degree in taxation, moved to California, became a successful CPA, and became president of the South San Francisco rotary club.



And, in 2006, he came back to Peoria, and announced he was paying back the gift that allowed a survivor of the camps "to live a wonderful life and live the American dream".

Albert gave out two college scholarships for Peoria central students that year. And the years that followed. Those scholarships have totaled over 150-thousand dollars to date.

Although albert died in 2018, his widow Diane has continued with the scholarships. She has assured Martha and I that they will

continue. In an email last week, Diane Blumenthal said "among other things, I think Al's story helps the students understand the value of education". It also shows the value of perseverance It shows the resilience of the human spirit...

And, for anyone in this club who has helped a second-grade student learn to read... who has planted a tree...who has built a dock for disabled kids...who has taken kids fishing...who has helped award a graduate's education...who has helped pay for a playground or build a bird sanctuary... or one of the many other good things members of this club have done. Just remember, the good we do can come back to help others in ways we cannot foresee, we cannot imagine.


