The head of ArtsPartners of Peoria, Dr. Mae Gilliland Wright, talked to Rotarians about and showed what the arts are doing in Central Illinois.

On a strictly economic basis, Mae Gilliland Wright says the arts in the Greater Peoria area is a 20.4-million-dollar industry with 850 full time jobs and \$2.2 million dollars in revenue. The job of ArtsPartners is to

make sure as many people as possible are aware of that. To that end, Dr Gilliland Wrights says that they're constantly "engaging the community with the arts."

FOUNDATION MINUTE - CREATE HOPE



Historically, Rotary has focused on providing long-term solutions to humanitarian needs around the world. But many Rotarians wanted to be able to help when disasters arise.

In response to emergency relief, The Rotary Foundation established a support fund to receive contributions for disasters that strike around the world. Entitled the Rotary Disaster Response Fund, RI staff in Programs and Grants reach out to the affected areas and their districts to assess the need and desire for funding. Upon a qualified response - much like a district grant - the affected district will be awarded funding in increments of up to \$25,000, consulting the TRF chair as needed. Only districts in the affected country may request a grant. These districts can apply for more than one grant and should some of the allocation not be used – the funds will be returned to the Disaster Fund. Should requests exceed available funds, the General Secretary of RI will triage requests until additional funds are available.

This fund enables Rotarians to make donations in response to disasters around the world through The Rotary Foundation. This is a fund that we hope we will never need but are thankful that it is there.

EVERY ROTARIAN, EVERY YEAR

Did you know that donors who gave \$25-\$50 contributed more than \$5.1 million to the Foundation in 2020-21? When every Rotarian gives every year, it makes life-changing, sustainable projects possible.

Also in 2020-21:

- \$139 million was given to the Annual Fund.
- 34% of Rotarians donated to the Annual Fund.
- 82% of Rotary clubs supported the Annual Fund.
- · 2,066 global grants were awarded.


So You Thought You Knew what Mick Hall Thinks About Building a Successful Local Retail Economy (In 200 Words or Less!)

Multi-Talented Rotarian Mick Hall is an avid diver and snorkeler. He thinks that whether you have ever been snorkeling, scuba diving or simply watching Planet Earth reruns, you know that coral reefs are the center of a complex ecosystem for countless marine species. When a coral reef is healthy, it offers opportunities for the survival of a wide range of fish and other creatures that rely on each other. Therefore, the coral reef grows and prospers. He feels that a strong local retail economy is akin to a healthy coral reef. He is extremely concerned about the impact online purchasing has on our local retail economy. A successful businessman who is very active in our community, Mick continues to share below.

"I believe that online shopping is as quietly dangerous to our local retail economy as environmental issues are to coral reefs. Each time a shopper avoids going to a local retailer and instead purchases online, no dollars are invested into our community through sales tax. The fewer sales a local retailer can make, the fewer employees the business will need. Eventually the company may be forced to close as we have seen far too often recently in Peoria. Look at Bergner's, JC Penny, Sears, Pier One or many others. The less we shop locally, the more unstable our retail economy becomes.

Online retailers don't support local charities or sponsor little league teams. Their executives don't serve on local charitable or civic boards. Amazon has no employees who participate on local Chamber committees. They add nothing to the fabric of our community. The convenience of online purchasing is a given. However, the impact on our community, especially now while our local businesses try to navigate the impact of COVID-19, is severe."
