Chris Kahl, spoke to Peoria Rotarians last Friday about the various programs Phoenix Community Development Services offers to those experiencing homelessness in the Central Illinois.

people in achieving and maintaining rehabilitative, resiliency and recovery goals.

Services consist of therapeutic interventions that facilitate illness self-management, skill building, identification and use of natural supports and use of community resources in order to achieve the highest level of self-sufficiency and to maintain housing stability and recovery. We provide Supportive Housing, Community Support, Homeless Outreach and Community Development Services to over 900 individuals annually.

FOUNDATION MINUTE - LEGACY



In 2020, people worldwide were confronted with their own mortality – as horrifying statistics bombard us daily about disease, Covid cases, contagion and death.

Although cases are down, we are still seeing the effects today as our world fell apart with businesses closing, material and food shortages, supply chain roadblocks and lost learning time children experienced.

As Rotarians, we claim to be People of Action, and peacemakers in a world of inequality of opportunity, food scarcity, disease and discord. We may feel helpless from the disruption these past few years have caused. But Rotary continues to aid those less fortunate through grants, while vaccinations are administered, and communities are improved. How will we be remembered for our Rotary service?

Rep. John Lewis left a message to be shared at his funeral – a message of hope and a call to action. He will truly be remembered for reminding us not to tolerate injustice – and to act while we can to "build a nation and a world society at peace with itself." Mr. Lewis urged us to "answer the highest calling of your heart and stand up for what you truly believe." Will our individual Rotary legacies reflect our Rotary service? How many children will we have saved from paralysis; how many students will be inspired

to serve as peacemakers; how many people will have clean water because of our generosity; how many families will have food on their tables because of our Rotary service; how many children will learn to ready because of Rotary literacy programs?

Now is the time to plan YOUR Rotary legacy – while time permits to plan, to share and to take action.

EVERY ROTARIAN, EVERY YEAR

Did you know that donors who gave \$25-\$50 contributed more than \$5.1 million to the Foundation in 2020-21? When every Rotarian gives every year, it makes life-changing, sustainable projects possible.

Also in 2020-21:

- \$139 million was given to the Annual Fund.
- 34% of Rotarians donated to the Annual Fund.
- 82% of Rotary clubs supported the Annual Fund.
- · 2,066 global grants were awarded.

So You Thought You Knew about Austin Locke (in 200 words or less!)

Our Fellow Rotarian Austin Locke had the privilege to visit Tanzania recently and go on Safari in the Serengeti. In April 2021 Austin took a group tour with 10 other people, which included his mom, Linda. And despite the COVID restrictions and the wildlife, they all made it back safe and sound. Austin was actually able to get a good deal because of COVID cancellations, and this tour group was the first one in over 16 months since the COVID shutdown basically stopped all tourism to Tanzania.





Tanzania is a former

British colony on the East coast of Africa and lies directly south of Kenya. It's home to Mt. Kilimanjaro, the highest free-standing mountain in the world, and Serengeti National Park, one of the most famous parks in the world. It's annual migrations have 1.5 million wildebeest and 250 thousand zebras.

Austin spent 9 days there, meeting the local people, and seeing all the wildlife Africa has to offer, including Elephants, Lions, Giraffes, Monkeys, Zebra, Wildebeest,

Gazelles and even Camels! The safari vehicles were large SUV vehicles that had a roof that would "Pop", allowing tourists to stand and get better photos while remaining somewhat safely protected. He also a hot air balloon ride over the Serengeti, the area

that the Maasai people describe as "the place where the land runs on forever".



It was a once in a lifetime trip and Austin highly recommends that anyone who loves nature should have IT on their bucket
