FamilyCore in Peoria has been around for 120 years, but you might not recognize it by that name. Over the years, the name has changed from Associated Charities to Family Welfare Association to Children and Family Services to Counseling and Family Services. As FamilyCore since 2010, the organization continues to provide adoption, child welfare, counseling, single parent support, and youth outreach services locally.

FamilyCore CEO Ann Lading-Ferguson told Peoria Rotarians on Friday the organization

she has headed for four years touches as many as 15,000 lives each year. Now operating out of its offices at 330 SW Washington, FamilyCore began in Peoria's City Hall in 1901. The organization boasts of many firsts,

including the first "visiting nurse" program locally.

Ann Lading-Ferguson says FamilyCore still goes visiting, most recently with workers reading with children in their

driveways. In times of Covid, it was a way of still connecting with the FamilyCore clients. While the names may have changed, the core message of "Strengthening Families for a Stronger Community" has not.



Patrick Kirchhofer grows wonderful agricultural projects through the Farm Bureau and helps cultivate community projects with his "Can-Do" attitude of "Service Above Self." Did this enthusiasm and "know-how" begin with experiences on his family's farm in Effingham County? Below he shares some insight into this question.

"I like growing corn. I've also branched out into growing trees!
When three, my enthusiasm for climbing became neighborhood news when I climbed to the top of the TV antenna on our neighbor's house. I graduated to climbing trees in my grade school years.

At 11, my love of trees leafed out. I helped my aunt and uncle plant 400 seedlings which prospered as did a patch of poison ivy, I unfortunately discovered. In 1992, I planted 100 walnut seeds on the family farm. I hulled the walnuts before planting them, keeping the stains on my hands for the next two weeks. The trees now stand 30-40 feet tall. The spring of 1994, we planted 200 hybrid Purdue Walnut trees. Each seedling received its own tubular greenhouse, grass mulch, and fertilizer. The spring of 1996 friends and family helped plant 600 oak seedlings. Doug Huff, recent Rotary District Governor, was part of this project and vividly remembers being sore on the ride back to Peoria. The tree planting times have been fun, created great wildlife habitat, and kept me in shape. Who knows what tree planting projects lie ahead?"
