Pam Johnson, Cody Giebelhausen & Jeff Giebelhausen The Madison Preservation Association Madison Theater Revival




"There's two reasons why this project can work and will work".

That's what Jeff Giebelhausen told Peoria Rotarians on Friday. The project he was talking about was the restoration of the Madison Theater in downtown Peoria. The Giebelhausen Group is heading

up in the attempt at resuscitating the old theater. Pam Johnson and Cody Giebelhausen joined Jeff Giebelhausen for the presentation.

The senior Giebelhausen said he has a contract with the Comfort family who own the building. The deal being

proposed pays the Comforts 1.3 million dollars for the property on Main Street, and in return the Comfort family donates the 1600 seat theater to the Madison Preservation Association. Using Historic Tax Credits and other government dollars would pay for part of the funding of the theater overhaul -- a total estimated to be 30 to 35 million dollars. Eight to ten million dollars of that would come from a capital campaign in the community. Giebelhausen said his proposed timetable would have the building reopening in the Spring of 2024. The Rotary Club of Peoria and Peoria North have entered our float in the Veterans Day Parade on Nov 11th.

Rotarians are asked to walk with the float. People should be in the area of Monroe and Wayne Streets (near the Central Fire Station) at 9:30 AM.

There will be limited space on the float/in the truck for people to ride, and they must be able to climb up.

We would encourage wheelchairs if people who want to participate but can't climb or walk. The majority of us will be walking the route and there will be plenty of helpers to push wheelchairs. Look for the big Rotary wheel!

The parade route is from Monroe to Main Street ending at the Peoria County Courthouse where there will be a short ceremony. We encourage people to wear red, white, and blue or Rotary colors. Rotary vests will be available on the float.


