Christell Yosunni Frausto & Cesar Suarez Greater Peoria Hispanic Chamber of Commerce



"The mission of the Greater Peoria Hispanic Chamber of Commerce is to grow commerce, community, and culture for Latinos in Greater Peoria". The Chair of the GPHCOC is Christell Yosunni Frausto, who spoke to Peoria Rotarians on Friday, she was joined by Chamber Secretary, Cesar Suarez. The goal of the Hispanic Chamber is to assist the community's business development. They offer startup,

financial and technical assistance to the Hispanic community.

For example, Christell Yosunni Frausto saw Monica Henderson of the Peoria Health Department speak at Rotary. Frausto was able to get Health Department documents translated into Spanish, so vendors at soccer games, for example, could be health department compliant. But it is not all about business.

Frausto says officially the Hispanic population may be about six percent, but she believes that eighty percent of the Hispanic population are undocumented and so go uncounted. So, along with helping businesses, the GPHCOC works to mentor and advocate as well.

Cesar Suarez said the Chamber serves in other ways and was able to assist in getting ten businesses loans of \$10,000 each during Covid. Suarez says it is not just helping businesses but helping to create leaders within the Hispanic community.

November 17th, 2021 for a local man who has trouble walking and uses a wheelchair to get around. Advocates for Access provided the materials, however there wasn't enough lumber to complete the project. So Rotarian Todd Davis went above and beyond by providing enough lumber so they could build the middle rail on the ramp. Chuck Gabbert, who took some of the pictures of the couple in East Peoria said: "Made me smile. I stood up there and talked hunting, sunshine and breezes with him. It will make the wife's life easier too!

It's a good thing." A long day but one that ended with a new ramp for the local man.
