Where We Were

- 1940s: 20,000 polio cases per year in US
- 1952: epidemic of 57,879 cases in US with 21,269 paralyzed and 3145 deaths
- 1954-55: Salk vaccine with 2-3 shots per child
- 1957: Sabine sugar cube vaccine
- 1979: No polio cases originated in US
- 1985: Rotary starts PolioPlus and acts as a spearhead and became the largest NGO donor
- 1988: Rotary and WHO initiates Global Polio Eradication Initiative (End Polio Now program) with a 2018 projected endgame; 350,000 cases WPV worldwide; 10% of children in world polio free



Where We Were


- 1993: last reported case of WPV in US was brought in by a traveler entering the US
- 2008: 99.9% worldwide children polio free; Gates Foundation challenged Rotary to raise \$200 million and they would donate \$355 million
- 2011: The Ambassador Program of "This Close" started
- 2013: Gates Foundation has pledged a match of 2 for 1 of Rotary funds up to \$35 millionyear
- 2018: Gates Foundation has pledged a match of 2 for 1 of Rotary funds up to \$50 million/year

Status in the World

- 2012: 223 cases of WPV
- 2013: 416 cases of WPV
- 2016: 37 cases of WPV (13 Afghan, 20 Pakistan, 4 Nigeria)
- 2017: 22 cases of WPV (14 Afghan, 8 Pakistan, 0 Nigeria)
- 2018: 33 cases of WPV (21 Afghan, 12 Pakistan, 0 Nigeria)
- 2019: 78 cases of WPV YTD (16 Afghan, 62 Pakistan)
- Nigeria close to being declared polio free for a second time



Where are We Going

International Polio Eradication Committee

- Type 3 poliovirus declared last seen 2012
- Type 2 poliovirus eradicated 2015
- Nigeria polio free since 2016
- Polio Endgame Strategy for 2019-2023 to finish in Afghanistan and Pakistan
- Three goals
 - Eradication
 - Collaboration to sustain eradication & strengthen Health systems
 - Certification and containment



Endgame

- Vaccinate 450 million children in 50 countries
- Continue to investigate possible cases by testing samples
- Increased technical support
- Vaccinating hard to reach children crossing Afghan-Pakistan border
- Education
- Dealing with warring factions, social media, inherent beliefs, non-vaxxers problems
- \$4.2 billion cost with a \$3.27 billion gap


Continued Public Awareness
