

The 2004 Action Auction demonstrates Champaign Rotary's commitment to "Lend a Hand" within our community.



Message from the President

Each year the Rotary International President establishes a theme for their term in office. The current theme is "Lend a Hand". I believe that the Champaign Rotary Action Auction serves as model for lending a hand of friendship, opportunity, and caring for our own community. Funds raised during the Action Auction are devoted to community projects that benefit the citizens of Champaign County.

Our goal is to raise **\$125,000**. These funds will be distributed to worthy projects over the next three years. To start the three year cycle, we have selected three initial projects which will receive significant support. **\$40,000** will go to the renovation of **Rotary Hill** at the Lake of the Woods. This community asset was initially constructed as the result of the very first Rotary Action Auction in 1977. The pavilion will be enclosed for year round use. In addition the Rotary Board has selected the **Illini Prairie Chapter**, **American Red Cross** to receive **\$10,000** for local disaster relief. And, we will donate another **\$10,000** to the **Health Watch Program at Provena Covenant Foundation** for Emergency Response for Seniors in Champaign County.

Action Auction 2004 takes a team effort to be successful. It starts with the Rotary volunteers dedicating themselves to "Lend a Hand" in planning, organizing and staffing the Auction. The Auction would not be possible if it were not for the generous contributions of our donors. Giving of time and resources in the service of others is most greatly appreciated and is the embodiment of the Rotary motto: Service-Above-Self. To complete the team we need you the Action Auction attendee to reach deep and out bid your friends in the spirit of caring and giving that has always been the hallmark of the Action Auction.

WGRC Action Auction Goal \$125,000

The goal of this year's auction is \$125,000. The auction allows the Champaign Rotary Club to continue its service to the community by supporting high impact projects over a three year period. Champaign Rotary has supported nearly forty different agencies through its charitable foundation WGRC, Inc. in the past three years. The success of the auction determines the level of charitable work that can be supported by Champaign Rotary. The first auction was in 1977 and has been held on three cycles as our major fund raising event. Below are listed the initial major projects to be supported by this our 10th action auction. Thanks to both our contributors and auction attendees who allow Rotary to achieve "Service Above Self".

Rotary Hill

Rotary Hill is an outdoor pavilion at Lake of the Woods which is enjoyed by numerous family and business groups when weather permits. This pavilion was constructed as a result of funds raised during the first Champaign Rotary Action Auction in 1977. Now the pavilion is going to be upgraded and enclosed to increase its utilization during periods of inclement weather. Rotary Hill is a community asset.

Illini Prairie Chapter, American Red Cross Local Disaster Relief

Disasters can strike at any time. House fire, tornadoes, heavy flooding and other natural or man-made disasters can turn people's lives upside down in an instant. Our contribution of \$10,000 will be used strictly for disaster relief, to provide victims with vital necessities in the immediate aftermath of a local disaster. The American Red Cross is the only agency in this area that provides the type of immediate assistance disaster victims need when help can't wait.

Health Watch Program at Provena Covenant Foundation Emergency Response for Seniors in Champaign County

"I've fallen and I can't get up". Imagine how any of us would feel if this happened and there was no one around to hear and offer aid to elderly individuals. The Health Watch Program answers this important community need 24/7/365 to those who are most at risk by providing personal transmitters. For the elderly, this service provides security and immediate response in the event of an emergency. The Health Program is dependent upon charitable contributions and our support will allow existing services to be continued and the program to be expanded.

HOW TO BE A Rotary Action Auction Professional

Preparing for the Auction

- 1. This is the catalog for the 2004 Rotary Action Auction. The difference between action and auction is "U".
- 2. Now is the time to form your buying/bidding syndicate. You can combine resources and gain buying power. Nice things happen to those who over bid!
- 3. Bring extra cash to the auction to buy raffle tickets. Tickets for the grand prize drawing will also be on sale the night of the auction. The Grand Prize is a Spheros 42 inch HD TV.
- 4. Don't forget to bring this catalog with you. It will allow you to follow the Auction and help record your bid price.

The evening begins with a party in the lobby of the Krannert Center with entertainment and cash bar at 5:30 p.m. on Friday, June 4, 2004. Be on time as you'll want to see your friends, preview auction items, and have plenty of time to stuff the raffle boxes.

- 1. Your first stop upon arrival is the reception desk (north end). Here you receive your bid number and find out the location of your reserved table.
- 2. Your next stop should be to purchase raffle tickets. Raffle items are listed in this catalog as the last 16 items. Here is how the raffle works:
 - a. Each raffle item has a box for raffle tickets just for that item. You place as many raffle tickets in each box as you like.
 - b. There are 16 raffle items. To have a chance at each item you must buy at least 16 tickets. Obviously, the more tickets you put in each box the greater your odds of winning.
 - c. Once the Auction starts at 7:30 p.m., we may be drawing raffle tickets a various times throughout the auction or at the end of the auction. This means that you should be sure to place your raffle tickets in the boxes early.
 - d. The raffle tickets are numbered and come in pairs. You keep one half of the pair (your claim ticket) and place the other half (same number) in the box of your choice. DO NOT PUT BOTH HALVES IN A BOX OR IN DIFFERENT BOXES. YOUR CLAIM TICKET IDENTIFIES YOU AS THE WINNER.
 - e. The claim ticket must be presented immediately to win. You may allow someone else to hold your tickets if you have to depart for any reason. If no one has the matching ticket, another ticket will be drawn until there is a winner.
 - f. Any raffle item which is opened and does not contain any tickets will be auctioned to the highest bidder.
 - g. Raffle tickets cost:

\$5.00 for 3 tickets \$10.00 for 7 tickets \$20.00 for 20 tickets 3. Now find your table, get something to drink, meet your friends and enjoy the social time. Don't forget to select your raffle items and preview the auction items on display.

4. Dinner will be served promptly at 6:30 p.m. Enjoy your meal.

5. Please refer to the rules and procedures of the Action Auction.

6. You are encouraged to pay for your successful bid (cash, check, Visa, or MasterCard) throughout the auction. Cashiers and their runners will be available to assist you throughout the auction. Of course, you may wait and pay for all your winning bids at the end of the auction. You must pay before departure.

7. You are requested to remove physical items after the auction or make arrangements with Carl Meyer.

The Grand Prize Drawing

The drawing for the grand prize will take place following the last auction item. You need not be present to win. Just be sure your name and address is placed on any Grand Prize ticket you purchase the night of the auction.

1. The Action Auction will begin immediately following the dinner hour and continue until all items are sold.

2. All buyers will be assigned a buyer number. Please show your buyer number when bidding to assist the Auctioneers and Spotters in properly identifying you as a bidder.

3. Payment should be made by the successful bidder immediately following the auction of the item. A committee member will bring a purchase receipt to each successful bidder for their immediate signature. You may choose to be escorted by the committee member to the cashier's table for settlement at that time or settle up with the cashier prior to leaving the Auction.

4. Payment can be made by cash, check, VISA, or MasterCard. All checks should be made payable to WGRC, Inc. 5. Values set forth for some items being auctioned, raffled, or given as prizes are estimates of general value.

6. All sales are final and there will be no exchanges or refunds except as specified by the donor. All auction items and services must be used within one year from the auction night, June 4, 2004, unless otherwise agreed upon by the donor and the purchaser. Trip items must be confirmed by the purchaser within 30 days of auction night. Special instructions pertaining to some items may be indicated on the purchase receipt. Please read your purchase carefully and completely.
