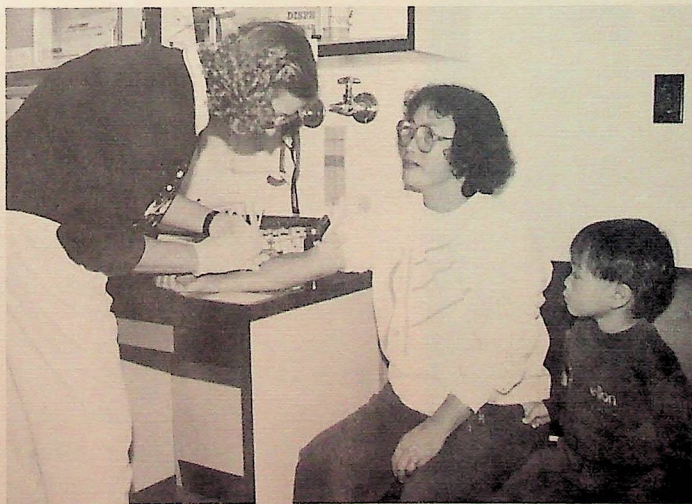
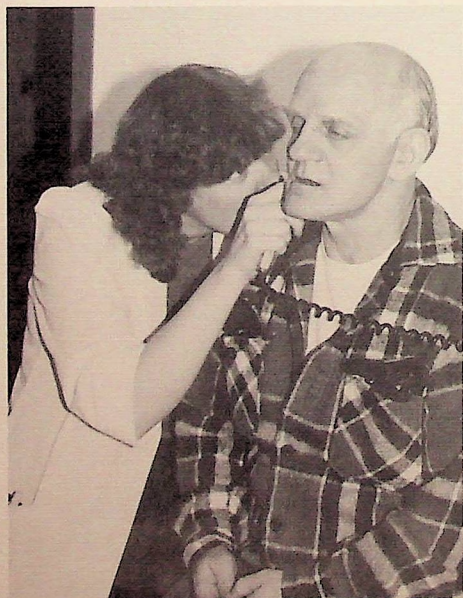
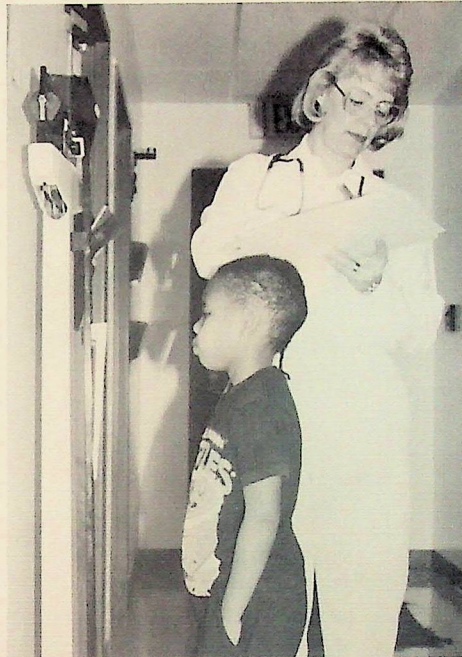

Frances Nelson Health Center Champaign, Illinois

The Frances Nelson Health Center has been in existence for 24 years. It opened in June, 1968 as an outgrowth of grassroots efforts involving the Urban League of Champaign County, SOUL (Solidarity, Opportunity, Unity, and Liberty) the Adler Zone Center (as State of Illinois Department of Mental Health Agency), and a local group of concerned physicians and community residents.

The health program was developed to address the lack of access to health care for low-income residents in North Champaign-Urbana. Infant mortality was high in the Black community and health care was inaccessible to the indigent because local providers did not accept Medicaid. Clinic sessions were held in the evenings and services were free.

In June of 1969, the Health Center moved to its present facility which was once a home for Black orphans. The Center was named after Ms. Frances Nelson who ran the home for many years. During this phase, the Center was financed with start-up funds from the Office of Economic Opportunity and local contribution. With limited funds, the Center relied on volunteer physicians, community residents, and health care providers to staff the clinic.

The first Public Health Service Grant was awarded by the Department of Health and Human Services to Frances Nelson Health Center in 1979. This award marked the beginning of the Center's second phase of development which changed its staffing pattern to include National Health Services Corps physicians and other paid professional and support staff.

Frances Nelson Health Center has become a community health center which provides quality medical, dental, lab, pharmaceutical and social services as well as health education to all, regardless of socioeconomic status. We are the only not-for-profit primary health care provider in the Champaign Area. Using a sliding fee scale, patients are charged according to income level and no one is denied services because of an inability to pay. Our providers are board certified/eligible and our physicians have hospital privileges at Carle Hospital and Covenant Medical Center. Frances Nelson Health Center is governed by a committed community board. 51% of the board members are clients of the Center.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO MAKE YOUR EVENING MORE ENJOYABLE

Preparing for the auction:

1. This is the catalog for the 1992 Action Auction. As Guy Duker Yogi Berra's speech writer once said, "The difference between Action and Auction is U."
2. Now is the time to form your buying/bidding syndicate. You can combine resources and gain power.
3. Bring extra CASH to buy Raffle Tickets (20 items) and your treasure chest key.
4. Don't forget to bring this catalog with you to allow you to follow the auction and help record your bid price.

The evening begins at 6:00 p.m. on Friday May 8.

1. Your first stop upon arrival is the reception table. Here you turn-in your ticket, receive your bid number, and find out the location of your reserved table. This stop is located in the corridor outside the Urbana Room, east side.

2. Your next stop (right next to the reception table) should be to buy Raffle Tickets. Here's how the raffle works:

a. Each raffle item has a box for raffle tickets just for that item. You may place as many raffle tickets in each box as you like.

b. There are 20 raffle items. To have a chance at each item requires you to buy at least 20 tickets (or one per raffle item).

Obviously, the more tickets you put in each box, the greater your odds for winning.

c. The raffle will take place immediately following the auction. This will give you plenty of time to buy your tickets and decide which raffle items you wish to compete for.

d. Any raffle item which is found to not have any tickets in its box, will be auctioned to the highest bidder.

e. Raffle Tickets Cost:

\$ 5.00 for 3 tickets

\$10.00 for 7 tickets

\$20.00 for 20 tickets

f. The Raffle tickets are numbered and come in pairs. You keep one half of the pair (your claim ticket) and put the other half (same number) in the box of your choice. DO NOT PUT BOTH HALVES IN A BOX OR IN DIFFERENT BOXES. YOUR CLAIM TICKET IDENTIFIES YOU AS THE WINNER.

3. The final stop before you get to the bar is to buy your treasure chest key. See page 27 for treasure chest information. This is a limited offer of 150 keys. So being early might

be a good idea.

4. Now that you're finally inside you can find your table, meet your friends and enjoy the gala surroundings. Don't forget to stuff your raffle tickets in the boxes of your choice. Raffle and Auction items will be on display for your review.

5. **Dinner will be served promptly at 7:00 p.m.** Enjoy your meal.

6. Please refer to the Rules and Procedures of the Action Auction on page 5. You are encouraged to pay for your successful bid (cash, check, Visa or Mastercard) throughout the auction. Of course, you may collect all your winning bids and pay at the end.

After the last auction item--**PICK YOUR PRIZE RAFFLE**

1. The Raffle boxes will be opened in sequence as listed in the catalog. The winning Raffle ticket will be drawn and the numbers will be announced. You must present the matching ticket (same number) to win. Yes, someone else (other than the owner) may hold your raffle ticket and claim the item. The winning number will be announced as they are drawn from the individual boxes. Any unclaimed numbers will be announced again once all raffle items have been drawn. At this time, if there is no claim, a second ticket will be drawn. This procedure will continue until a winner is found. Important to be alert and watch and listen for your number.

2. Cashiers will be prepared to accept payment for auction items throughout the evening. You must pay before departure in the True Rotary Spirit. You are requested to remove physical items that evening, or make arrangements with Greg Lykins for delivery.

You may choose to be escorted by the hostess to the cashiers table for settlement at that time or settle up with the cashier prior to leaving the Auction.
4. Payment can be made by cash, check, Visa, or Mastercard. All checks should be made payable to WGRC, Inc.

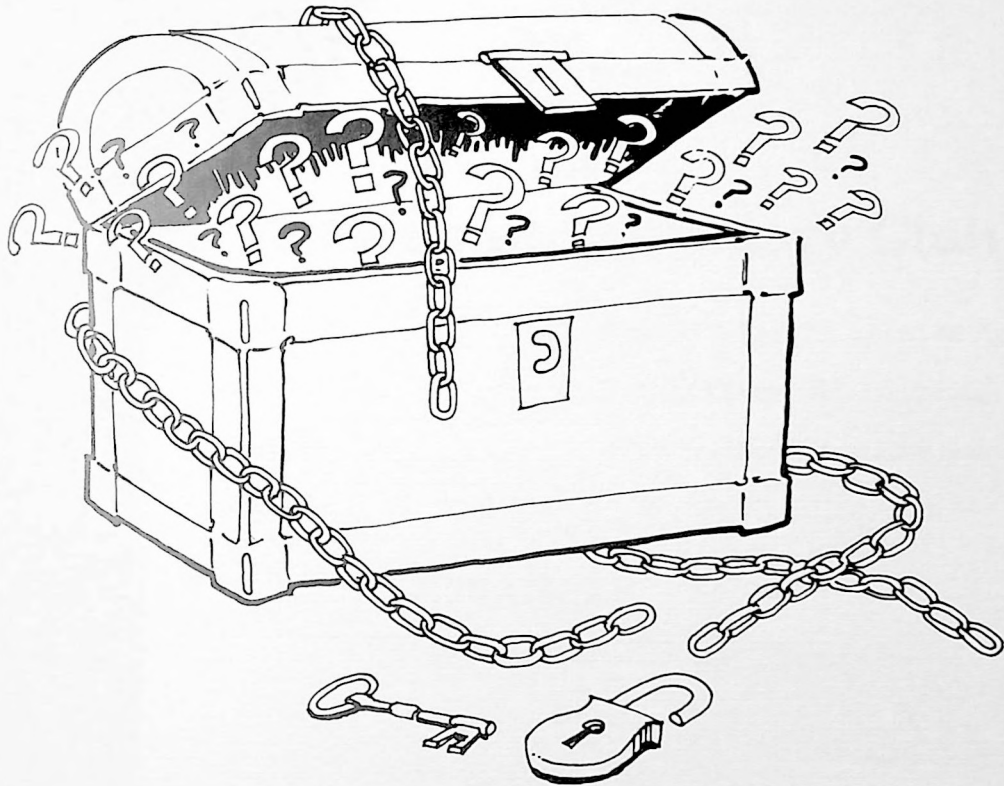

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

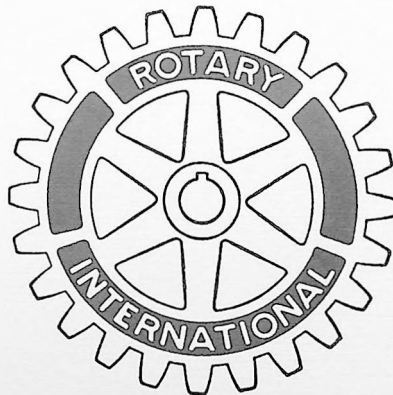
