Rotary Youth Exchange promotes peace through cultural understanding and develops leadership in youth.

The US Dept. of State (Exchange Visitor Program), : increase diversity, strengthen instruction, and build programs that imbue students with global competence.

2018-19: ~10,000 Student Exchanges





Sponsor A US Student Outbound:

- Club costs to sponsor outbound: \$0
 - Any club assistance to student is entirely discretionary

Host A Foreign Student Inbound:

- Annual budget estimate: ~ \$2,000
- Find host families for student in same school district
- Appoint a club Youth Exchange Officer (YEO) and Youth Exchange Counsellor (YEC)






