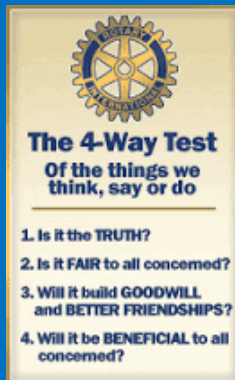

LEIGH MORRIS LEADERS OF TOMORROW SCHOLARSHIP

The mission of the Rotary Club of La Porte is to bring community leaders together to improve the quality of life in the community and the world. Two of the club's primary areas of emphasis are focused on preparing leaders of tomorrow:

- Enabling young people to reach their potential—mind, body and spirit
- Fostering the development of next generation community leadership

The Scholarship is named for Leigh Morris, who served Rotary and the community in many leadership roles for decades. The focus of it is to encourage the young people to prepare to be leaders of tomorrow. We're encouraging new graduates from La Porte High School, South Central, New Prairie and Tri-Township Schools to apply for a Leigh Morris Leaders of Tomorrow Scholarship. Awards will be heavily focused on recognizing and supporting young women and men who demonstrate leadership ability, more so than academic standing alone.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

The Leader of Tomorrow Scholarship is available to candidates who meet all of the following requirements:

- They are Entering or enrolled in an accredited college, university or trade school for the coming academic year, with
- A proven track record of contributing to the community, clear career aspirations, and demonstrable and/or developing leadership qualities.

HOW TO APPLY

Application forms are available on the Rotary Club's website, rotaryoflaporte.com. Individuals can apply by completing the application form and submitting it on-line at rotaryoflaporte.org or by mail to Scholarship Chairman, Rotary Club of La Porte, Post Office Box 513, La Porte, IN 46352-0513 no later than February 28. The following attachments should be included:

- ◆ An official high school transcript for proof of GPA and enrollment.
- ◆ At least two letters of recommendation

HOW IT'S AWARDED

The recipient will have a proven track record in making a difference in other people's lives through exceptional community involvement, demonstrable leadership, and a strong commitment to his or her own professional development and career path. Applications will be reviewed by the club's Grants and Scholarship Committee and selection of recipients will be approved by the club's Board of Directors.
