What is RLI?

The world of Rotary is so much bigger than just your club and district; and there are numerous Rotary resources that are designed to give club members access to tools, services, expertise, and ideas that will help you deliver needed services and support to your communities, near and far.

The Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) is a series of fast-paced, interactive, one-day courses offered to increase a Rotarian's base of knowledge in Rotary and strengthen their leadership skills. The courses are fun, topical, and geared toward active Rotarians who want to be more effective leaders in their clubs.

What Will I Learn?

RLI is structured across three one day courses, consisting of 6 modules each, progressing through Parts I, II, and III. Each Part takes one Saturday. They are designed to provide a broad range of Rotary knowledge and skills to help you better serve your club and community.

Some examples of courses include: Creating Hands On Service Projects, International Service, Public Relations, Membership Development, Rotary Leadership, Internal and External Communications and many others.

How Is Material Presented?

RLI training provides you with interactive and collaborative learning sessions while you sit alongside your fellow club, district, state, and even zone members, to explore issues and potential solutions.

Course methods include discussion groups, group challenges, problem solving session. Everyone participates and Rotarians learn from each other.

A course workbook containing the topics and notes for each session, agendas, faculty listings, and course outlines are provided to each student.

Why Should I Attend?

Whether you are thinking of joining a club committee, a temporary task force to help solve a club challenge, or hope at some point in your Rotary career to take on a leadership role in your club, RLI training can help you to be more effective and successful in your club endeavors.



At the completion of your training, you will have a much broader and more informed perspective of how to help your club address and solve your community's needs. You will learn about new Rotary

resources and build new peer relationships with like-minded Rotarians to help you in your Rotary endeavors.

When and Where?

Courses are held at convenient locations within Indiana District 6560, but club members may take a course in any district and location that it's offered, even in other states.

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Who Are the Faculty?

Faculty members are carefully selected by District 6560 leadership for their teaching abilities and communications skills. Many are present and past district governors and club presidents and those with experience in special areas of Rotary.

Each faculty member must attend facilitation training.

How Do I Sign Up?

Go to www.hoa-rli.org and select the RLI Events tab, then the correct session and date for District 6560. All sessions, I, II, and III are taught on the same day so you will select the next one in the series as you complete them over time.

The current course fee is \$50 and is often paid by clubs. This covers the cost of the facility, training materials, and breakfast, lunch, and snacks for the participants. To be certain of your funding, please inform your club Treasurer that you plan to attend.
