ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP-CITIZENSHIP PROGRAM

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis or worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster four aims:

First — The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

Second — High ethical standards in business and the professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

Third — The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life; and

Fourth — The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world of fellowship or business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

As part of its Community Service programs the Lafayette Rotary Club has established a Scholarship and Citizenship Program to recognize high school seniors who have consistently exercised principles of good citizenship and achieved exceptional scholastic records. This annual Scholarship and Citizenship Awards Luncheon for the top scholars in each of the high school in Tippecanoe County was started in 1945 by Rotarian Eric A. Holm. Seven hundred and sixty-four young men and women, including those honored today, have received Rotary Scholarship-Citizenship Awards over the past 70 years.

ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Rotary Scholarship are presented in memory of three Rotarians, Thomas F. Moran, Sr., Eric A. Holm, and Frank K. Burrin, who have played significant roles in advancing the ideals of Rotary and in promoting citizenship and scholarship.

Thomas F. Moran, Sr. was a Professor of History at Purdue University and the first President of the Lafayette Rotary Club. The first meeting of the Club was May 1, 1916, and was held in the Lahr Hotel. Thomas F. Moran, III, grandson of Thomas F. Moran was also a member and Past-President (1990-1991) of the Club.

Eric A. Holm started the Scholarship and Citizenship Programs in 1945. Eric received his bachelors and masters degrees from Purdue University and was an agriculture extension specialist at Purdue for 35 years before retiring in 1972. Eric was a 57 year member and Past President of the Club (1975-76)

Frank K. Burris was instrumental in starting the Lafayette Rotary Foundation, Inc. which funds all the scholarships. Frank received his bachelor's degree from Wabash College and his master's degree and doctorate from Purdue University. He is the author of the book Edward C. Elliott Educator. He was employed by Purdue for 35 years and was Director Emeritus of Continuing Education at the time of his retirement. Frank too was a long time member of the Lafayette Rotary Club and a Past President (1969-70) as well.
