"Dayton Beer: A History of Brewing in the Miami Valley"



Speaker: Tim Gaffney, Author

Dayton Beer covers brewing history in western Ohio from Montgomery County north to Auglaize County, and from Darke County to Clark County. My presentation today will limit itself to four families who shaped Dayton so brewing industry in the 19th century: the Schwinds, Schantzes, Wehners and Olts. These families and their brewing businesses became closely intertwined over the last half of the century until they formed a single combine that dominated Dayton so brewing industry until Prohibition.

Weekly at Monday Meetings to benefit the Dayton Rotary Foundation \$1 per ticket/\$5 for 6 tickets



## An Update on Rotary Book Club


The December meeting of Book Club was a special one. How phenomenal to read two books about the Wright Brothers and Katherine Wright and discuss at Hawthorn Hill!

Dean Alexander and Brady took us on a tour of the house we will never forget.


