"How the GWDI is Helping West Dayton Business Thrive"



The Greater West Dayton Incubator (GWDI) was conceived at the intersection of the University of Dayton's (UD) most recent strategic visioning process and intentional conversations with Greater West Dayton community leaders. The GWDI is the first tangible outcome of these dialogues and represents a reciprocal relationship that can benefit all stakeholders equitably. This includes serving as a catalyst for generational wealth creation and inclusive economies in Greater West Dayton, while enhancing experiential learning opportunities that prepare students for a diverse and competitive 21st Century workforce and society. In this presentation, director Whitney Barkley will share the origins of the GWDI and why it is relevant and necessary inside of Dayton's entrepreneurial ecosystem.

This Happened Last Monday...

President Shaun Yu called the meeting to order and took a minute to recognize the Red Ribbon Committee for their amazing job creating the most remarkable takeover meeting of all his years in Rotary. He referred to pictures on the screen and stated that takeover was so successful, they raised nearly \$25,000 in donations for the K-9 program. He requested that the Red Ribbon Committee stand and accept a round of applause for their deserved recognition. He also recognized Iris Juergens for all her hard work and leadership. President Yu also added that the Youth Peace Advocacy, Leadership and Service Day which occurred on April 23rd at Sinclair and mentioned that Kelly Lehman would present later in the meeting on the event. President Yu called up Bill Nance to give the invocation, 4-Way Test and Pledge to the Flag.

Bill Nance spoke about life and how it is like a camera. Just focus on what's important, capture the good times, develop from the negatives, and if things don't work out, take another shot. How do we do that? Maybe go to the Master photographer. He then led in the 4-Way Test and the Pledge to the Flag. Next up was news headlines of the day regarding prayer front and center at the supreme court, Justices will hear arguments for a Washington State High School football coach who was fired for quietly but visibly kneeling on the field. He reported a new survey which showed job switchers are experiencing double digit pay increases. Krista Sheneman (a 33-year-old artist with type 2 diabetes) walked from Cincinnati, OH to her hometown Memphis, TN totaling 470 miles in 23 days to inspire others with type 2 diabetes, a bus thief stealing multiple buses tried billing gas to Greyhound and while waiting for his receipt, was arrested. Michelle Feltz welcomed guests to the club including Marc Pedro (Dan McBride), and Liz Ball (Judd Plattenburg). Guests were welcomed.

Secretary Linda Groover then came to the podium and started with fines for red ribbons, Rotary pin and mixed tables. She then recognized this week's birthdays. Linda announced the Addam's Family presented by Muse Machine on Friday June 17, 2022 at 6:30 at the Schuster Center. There is a limit of 40 people so get your reservations made.

Linda then called on Rotarians for Day-10s. Charlie Campbell gave a Day-79 and counting for his birthday. Bob Hoopes gave a Day-100 to the K-9 project, Carolyn Rice gave a Day-100 for several reasons, Howard Ducker gave a Day-300 (100 this years birthday and 200 for each birthday during the pandemic), Amy Radachi gave a Day-100 for her youngest son who will graduate from the Navy and received orders to Maryland with the NAC. Dave Williamson gave Day-20 to congratulate the Peace Committee, particularly Kelly Lehman and the 17 Bosnian students, Holly Wiggins gave a Day-21 for seeing everyone in person and for Amy Radachi's son and those that keep us safe.

Linda then turned the meeting back over to President Shaun. Shaun then asked who has signed up so far for the Rotary Day of Service on April 30th. He encouraged those that still want to sign up will need to see Amy Radachi today, being the last day and he shared a few details about the upcoming National Rebuilding Day for Rebuilding Together Dayton and logistics information.

Bill Nance interviewed Kelly Lehman. She gave a brief review of the Youth Peace Day on April 23rd at Sinclair. She reported that the Dayton Daily News published a great article featuring the day spotlighting the Dayton Rotary club. A slideshow of pictures in review of the event was shown to the club as she spoke. She detailed the 550 kits put together by 34 kids and 13 adults in 3 hours! So impressive! Kelly shared her passion for the Peace Committee and being able to share peace with the young individuals who helped with this project. Bill Nance thanked Kelly and Susan and those that participated.

President Shaun Yu called to the podium Frank Scott to present Paul Harris fellowship awards. He recognized Iris Juergens for her 2nd, Gerry Chadwick his 3rd, Kelly Lehman her 5th, Steve Naas for his 7th and 8th, Greg Birkmeyer his 6th. He congratulated everyone for their hard work and dedication to the club!

President Yu introduced the chair of the day, Kelly Lehman (quite popular today!). Kelly expressed her joy to be introducing the speaker today, Tony Kroeger. Tony is the planning division manager for the City of Dayton since 2006, a graduate of Miami University and received his master's degree from Clemson University. He grew up in Cincinnati, Ohio, and came to Dayton from Greenville, South Carolina. He wishes to share his sense of wonder and excitement about cities with others, especially his children, Luke and Ben. He and his family live in the St. Anne's Hill historic district in Dayton. The author spoke of the significant chapters within the book and certain facts about the history of Dayton and shared some unknown facts about the North, West, East and South side of Dayton in his talk. He offered available copies of his book today to the club for purchase at a discounted price of \$10.00 at the end of the presentation.

Shaun presented the speaker with a small gift. The Queen of Hearts weekly winner was Linda Groover who drew an Eight of Clubs. Shaun thanked all our guests for joining us and hopes they will all consider membership in the future.

Participants today will also include a group of 15 students and three teachers from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Lehtman said, who are spending three weeks in Dayton as part of an exchange program through the U.S. State Department and the U.S. Embassy, Sarajevo.

The group, which arrived in Dayton in mid-April, is learning about democracy, diversity, volunteerism, civic discourse and community engagement alongside American peers while also getting a taste of American life by staying with local host families, according to Miranda Brooks, of the Dayton Mediation Center.

The visiting teachers and teenage students recently attended a Dayton City Commission meeting and afterwards got to experience America's pastime at a Dayton Dragons game.




