

*"Montgomery County Juvenile Court - A Judicial Perspective"*



Judge Capizzi will be retiring at the end of the year from the Montgomery County Juvenile Court having served 18 years on the juvenile bench. He'll break down the statistical reality of who, why, and when parties use the juvenile court. He'll describe the Court's mission and detail the various services offered by Juvenile Court. Judge Capizzi will offer his thoughts on what has changed over his 43 years practicing law in Central Ohio and discuss the challenges facing this community in protecting children and families while maintaining public safety.

## This Happened Last Monday...

The meeting called to order by President Shaun Yu. It has come to our attention that former long-time Rotarian, Fred Weber passed away last week. His service was held last Wednesday. The Rotarians held a moment of silence in his honor.

Bill Nance led the group in an Invocation, 4 way Test and Pledge to the Flag. News of the day: Economic experts warn that the US Economy is on shaky footing despite what many perceive to be a positive April employment report. The economy saw solid job growth despite rising interest rates, soaring inflation and a worsening labor shortage. Employers added 428,000 jobs in April. The rate of unruly passengers on planes fell to its lowest level since 2020, a week after a Federal Judge ended a government mask mandate for public transportation. There were 1.9 reported instances per 10,000 flights for the week ending April 24<sup>th</sup> compared to 4.4 instances per 10,000 flights the week before. About 70% of reported instances involved mask wearing. In Rotary Serves to change lives news the Rotary club of Colior Tennessee treated about 300 children with special needs and their families to a complimentary evening of Hot Air Balloon Rides Food and Activities. 80 Rotarians from 7 clubs assisted and the clubs generated \$30k in donations to cover expenses. A couple of thieves should have thought better. They went into a Brazilian store and stole bread, milk, drinks, biscuits and chocolate and then returned for more. In the meantime, police were called and when the thieves came back they were arrested. They had forgotten the butter for the bread.

Linda reminded the group of the upcoming Muse Machine event in June and suggested getting reservations in to Laura. Linda then opened the floor up to voluntary Day-10s. Kim Bramlage gave a Day-100 for the upcoming Five Rivers Hatth Edgemont Campus grand opening this week. Cindy Garner gave a Day 50, \$25 goes to congratulate her daughter graduating and \$25 in honor of Brandon McClain who is part of the Men at Work Clothes that Work Campaign. Chuck Watts gave a Day \$30 for his guest to speak about the Human rights pocket books venture and what it means to her students. Dean Alexander gave a Day \$150- this year is the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of Paul Lawrence Dunbar and he distributed a flyer about events celebrating the anniversary. Gerry Chadwick gave a Day 100 for the Tour De Gem and encouraged local non-profits to get registered as fundraising participants and also encouraged bikers to be part of the Rotary Team. Adam Horseman gave a Day 10 - His office is having food trucks this Friday for anyone who would like to take part. Karla Garrett Harshaw gave a Day 100 -to announce that she is now the Administrator of Iddings Foundation. Amanda Burks gave a Day 34 - Ronald McDonald House is growing and down to 4 million needed to complete their capital campaign.

President Shaun called on Annie Foos to have her Red Ribbon removed. She then introduced our speaker for the day, Brandon McClain - Montgomery County Recorder to speaker about the Montgomery County Veteran Identification Program. We must do everything possible to serve those that have faithfully served our country. The goal is to remove barriers veterans encounter in receiving benefits that they have already earned. We have about \$54,000 veterans in the Miami Valley. Currently, about 3,000 veterans have received this identification card. It is a State-approved Identification Card. Brandon told a personal story about his uncle who passed away several years ago with cancer due to agent orange. He couldn't prove his service to his country even though he had given so much. Mr. McClain made a pledge at that time that if he ever had the opportunity to make it easier for those who serviced to be able to prove their service, he would do so. This new identification card is available to ALL honorably discharged veterans. There is no cost for them at all. All you need to do is bring your ORIGINAL DD214 and 2 forms of ID. Many forms of ID are

The card is used in tandem with the DD214 and will help the Veterans get a multitude of discounts in our community and prove their service for benefits they are entitled to. His office is happy to help overcome obstacles for our Veterans and you can call for help.
