

Bill Nance and the Chair of the Day introduced the guest speaker, Congressman Mike Turner, who provided a "Legislative Update" during his

Congressman Mike Turner, a seasoned representative hailing from Ohio's 10th congressional district, has consistently played a pivotal role in shaping policies that bolster national security, foster economic growth, and drive technological innovation.

In his opening remarks, Congressman Turner expressed gratitude to the Rotary Club of Dayton and the local community for their unwavering support, effective advocacy, and strategic planning initiatives. He acknowledged Dayton's exceptional vision as a model community.

Highlighting the power wielded by the US Congress in fiscal matters, Turner shed light on his successful efforts to secure substantial funding for projects benefiting the Dayton region. Notably, he secured \$110 million in funding over the past two years to support various initiatives within the

A key focus of Turner's advocacy is the Wright-Patterson Air Force Base (WPAFB), a significant employer with a workforce exceeding 35,000 individuals and growing. Turner emphasized the necessity of infrastructure development to sustain the base's expansion, citing a pipeline of projects valued at over \$400 million. Notably, \$53 million of this funding is allocated for the establishment of two childcare facilities aimed at accommodating the base's growing workforce.

Congressman Turner's commitment to showcasing Dayton and WPAFB's significance extends to bringing fellow congress members, including Speaker of the House Kevin McCarthy and the House Intelligence Committee, to the base and Dayton. This exposure underscores WPAFB's critical role within the broader US intelligence community. During their visits, these officials also engage in local activities such as attending a Dayton Dragons game at Day Air Ballpark


In his capacity as the Chair of the House Intelligence Committee, Turner's responsibilities encompass oversight and funding for intelligence operations. He emphasized his dedication to fostering a bipartisan committee that recognizes and honors the indispensable contributions of the intelligence community.

The session concluded with Congressman Turner addressing questions posed by members of the Rotary Club, providing insight into various aspects of his legislative work and perspectives.


Please consider helping students in need as they head back to school this fall! Most requested items include:
