Dave Williamson and the Chair of the Day introduced the guest speaker, Patricia Shafer the Executive Director of NewGen Peacebuilders which is the implementing organization for Youth & Peace in Action (YPA)

Patricia mentioned that "This Thursday" is the International Day of Peace, which is indeed observed on September 21st every year. This day was established by the United Nations and focuses on promoting peace and non-violence worldwide. She also mentioned that this year's theme is "Service in Peace in Service of #GlobalGoals," emphasizing the importance of service and development in the context of achieving global goals, particularly in education and literacy.

Patricia emphasized the close relationship between peace and development. She expressed the idea that you cannot have sustainable development

without peace, highlighting the importance of a peaceful environment for progress and prosperity.

She mentioned her father-in-law's recent passing and how he was laid to rest at West Point, where he had been a graduate and instructor. She also spoke about her niece, Abby, who graduated from West Point and plans to attend Columbia Medical School. Patricia expressed her hope that Abby won't have to serve in battle.

Patricia spoke about how the Rotary has a special Nonprofit Status with the United Nations. For over 100 years the Rotary has been calling for
