 - Nancy Farkas – This is her 2nd Paul Harris award

Chair of the Day & Program

Chair of the Day, Sarah Hippensteel Hall introduced the day's speaker, Tracey Tomme, Executive Director of the Dayton Society of Natural History.

Tracey shared updates on the Boonshoft Museum, including current projects and upcoming plans to improve the visitor experience as well as the care of our zoo animals.

Highlights include:

- The addition of a new accessible bathroom with universal changing table.
- The creation of two new life-size mastodon models in the lobby - Feather & Stone. Skulls found in a nearby bog were used to make the models and they are currently the two most accurate representations of mastodons in North America.
- The renovation of the entrance to Hall of the Universe
- The relocation and redesign of the Guest Services desk

The next phase of projects includes renovating the soft surface area, water table exhibit, and climb-on structure, along with adding a Five Rivers MetroParks fountain.

Future plans for the organization include renovations at SunWatch Village.

Queen of Hearts


Paul Harris Fellowship Recognition



